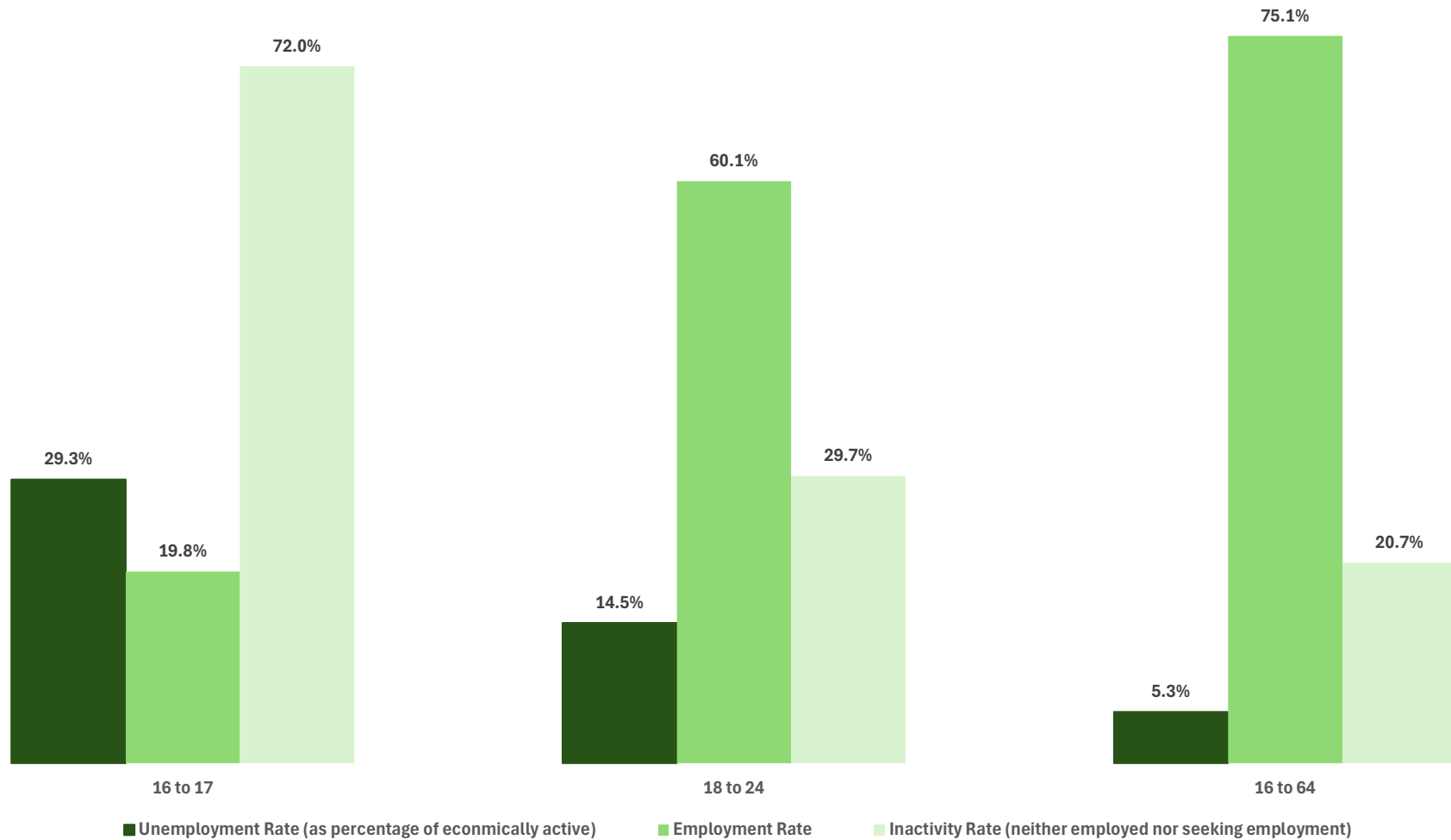

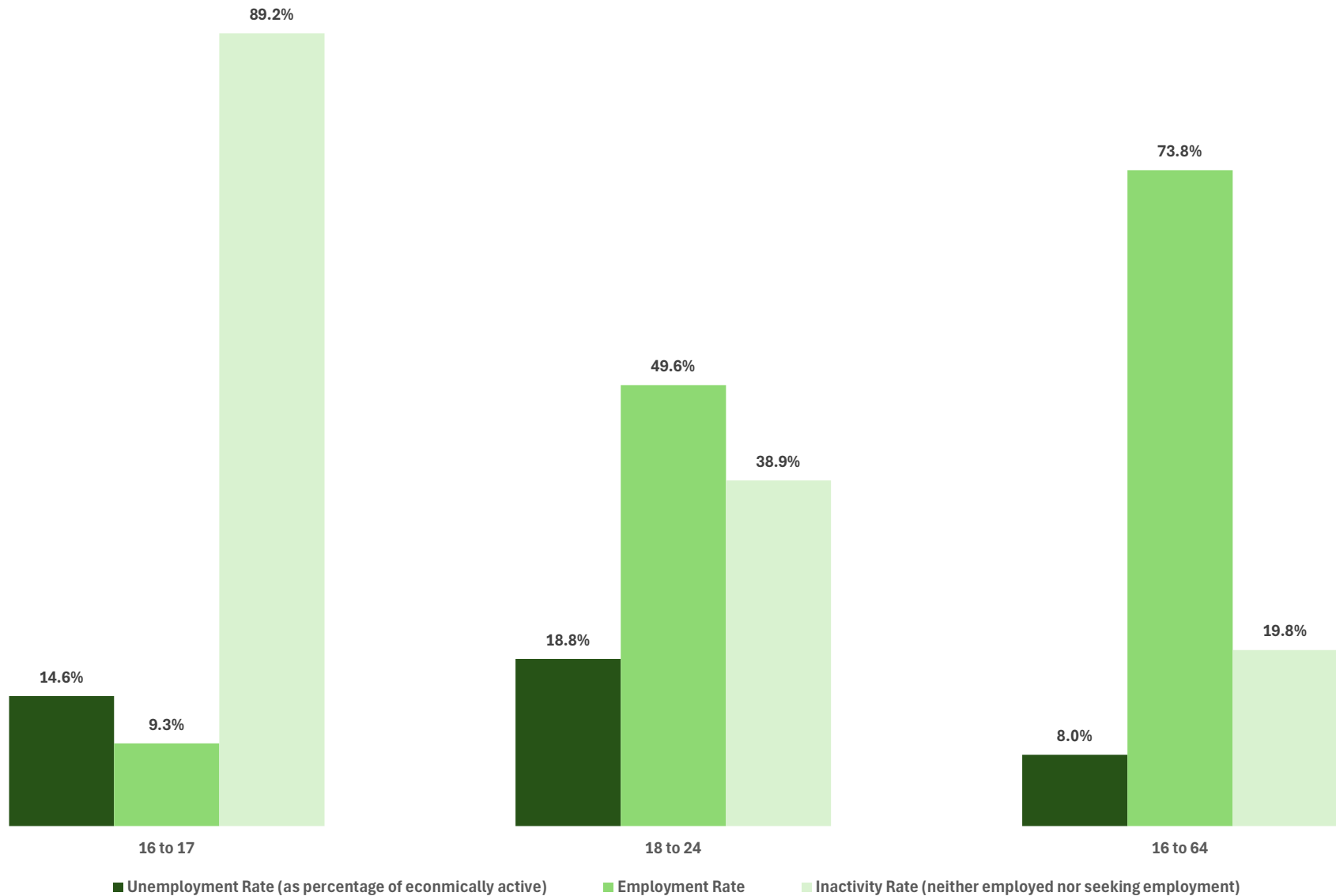

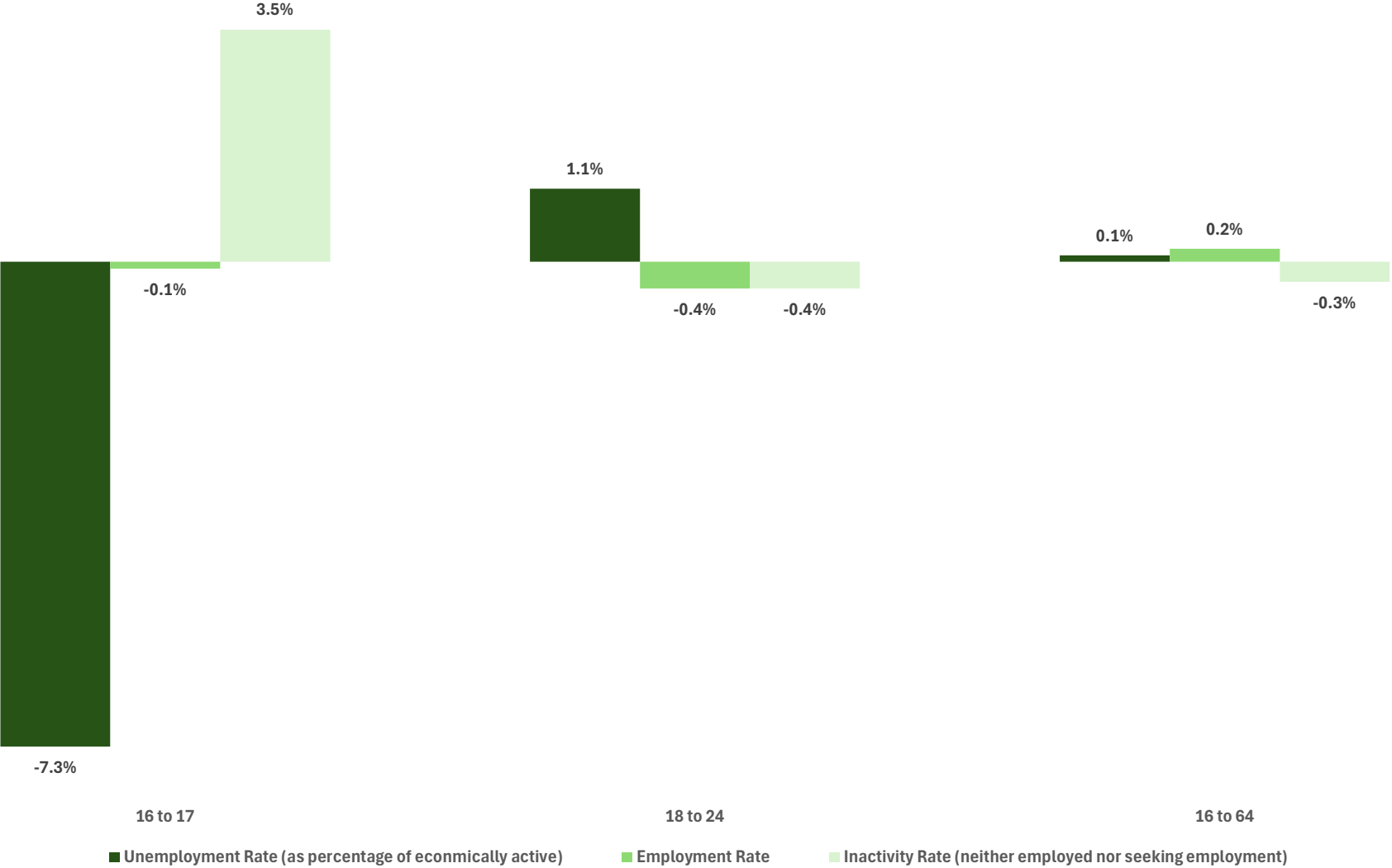
Unemployment, Employment and Economic Inactivity Rates for the current reporting period - UK



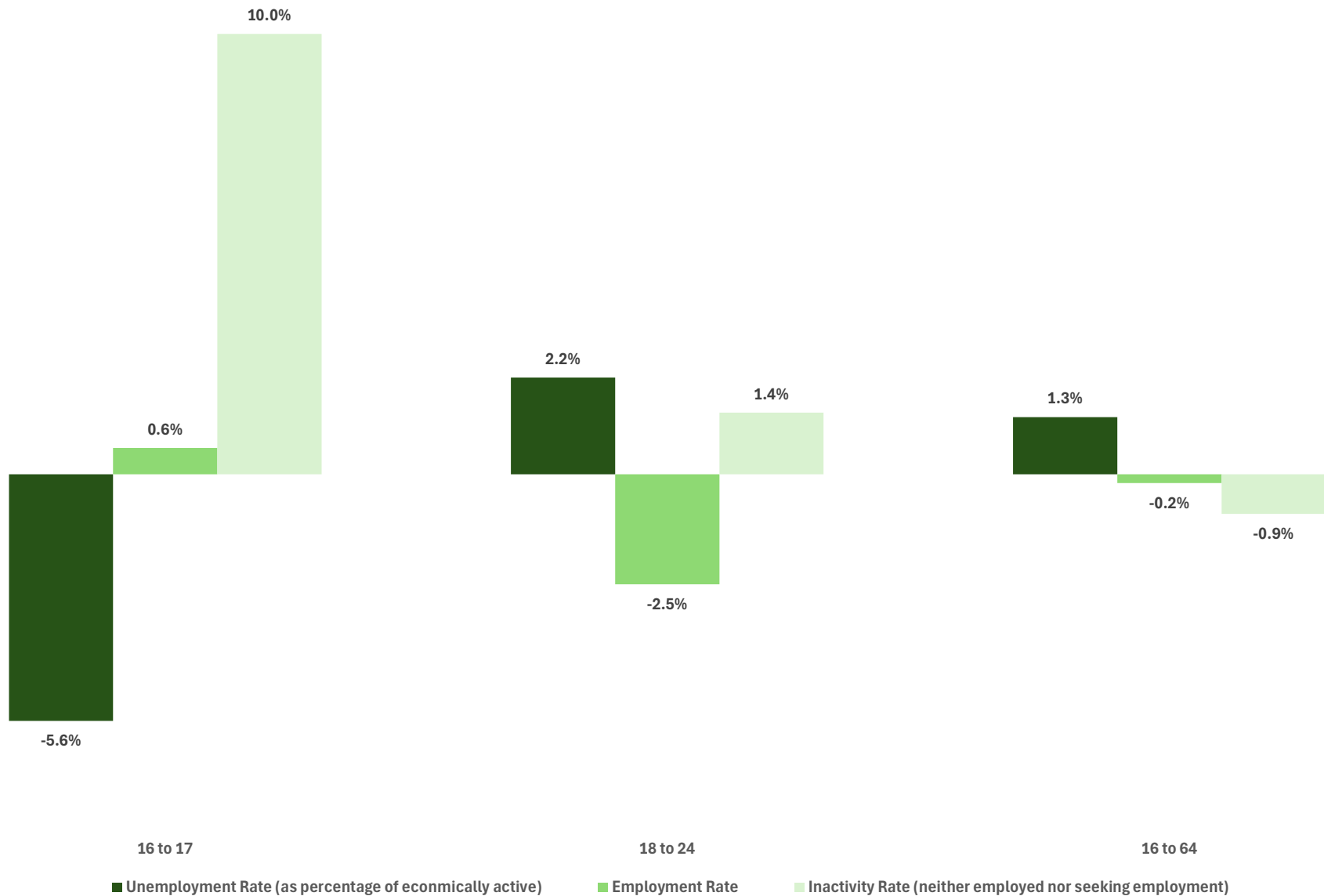
Unemployment, Employment and Economic Inactivity Rates for the current reporting period - London



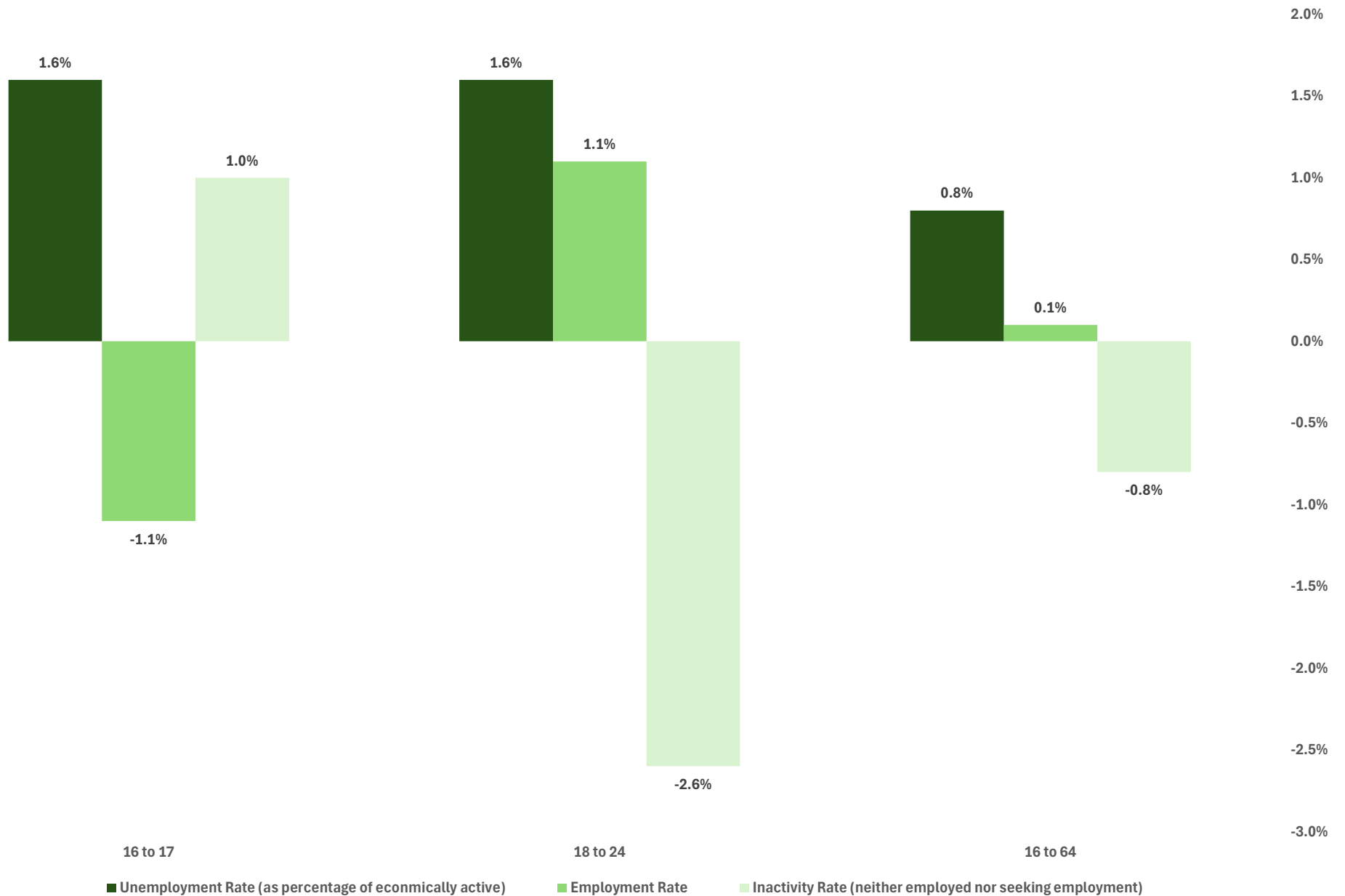
Changes to Unemployment, Employment and Economic Inactivity Rates
since the previous reporting period - UK



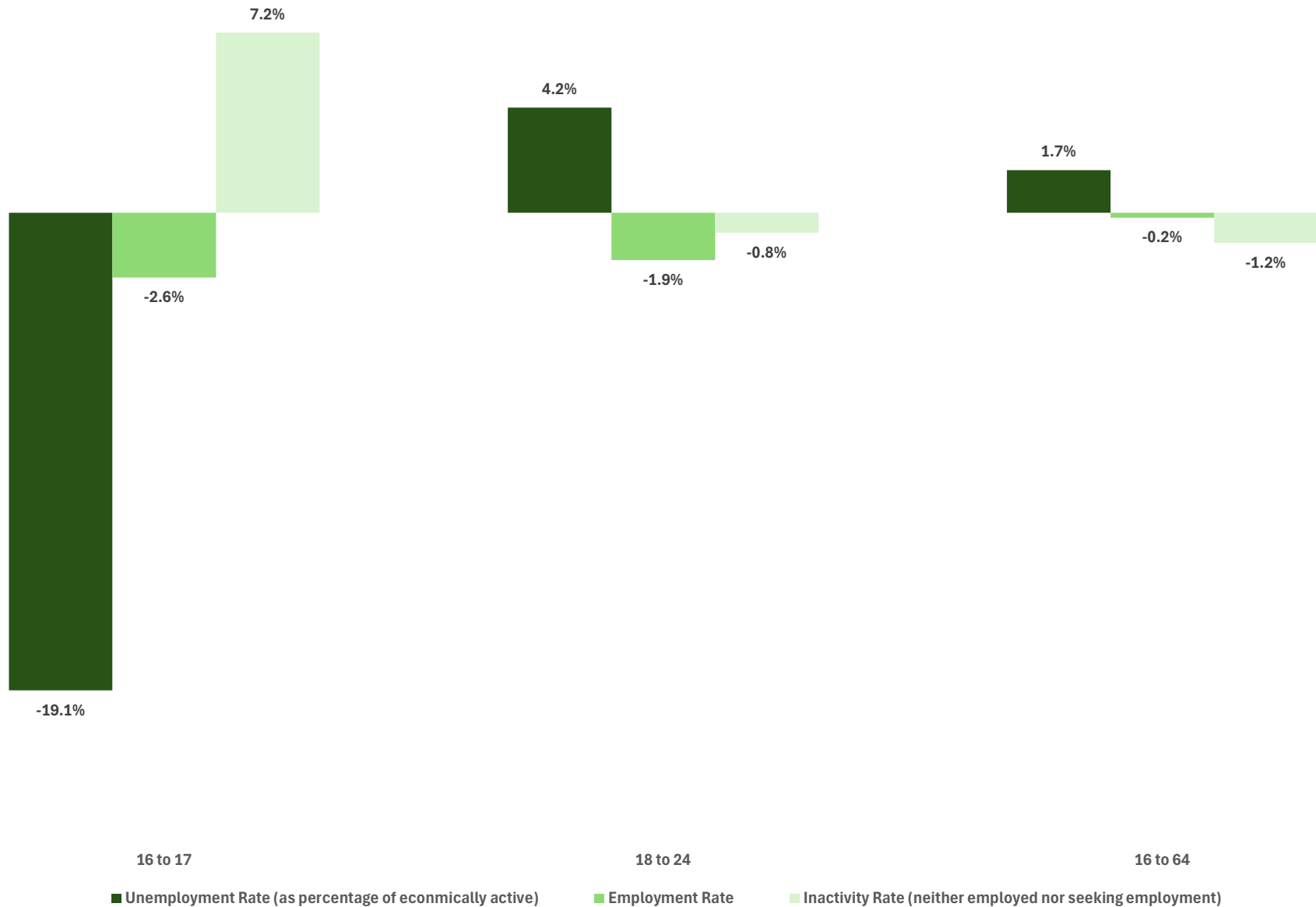
Changes to Unemployment, Employment and Economic Inactivity Rates since the previous reporting period - London



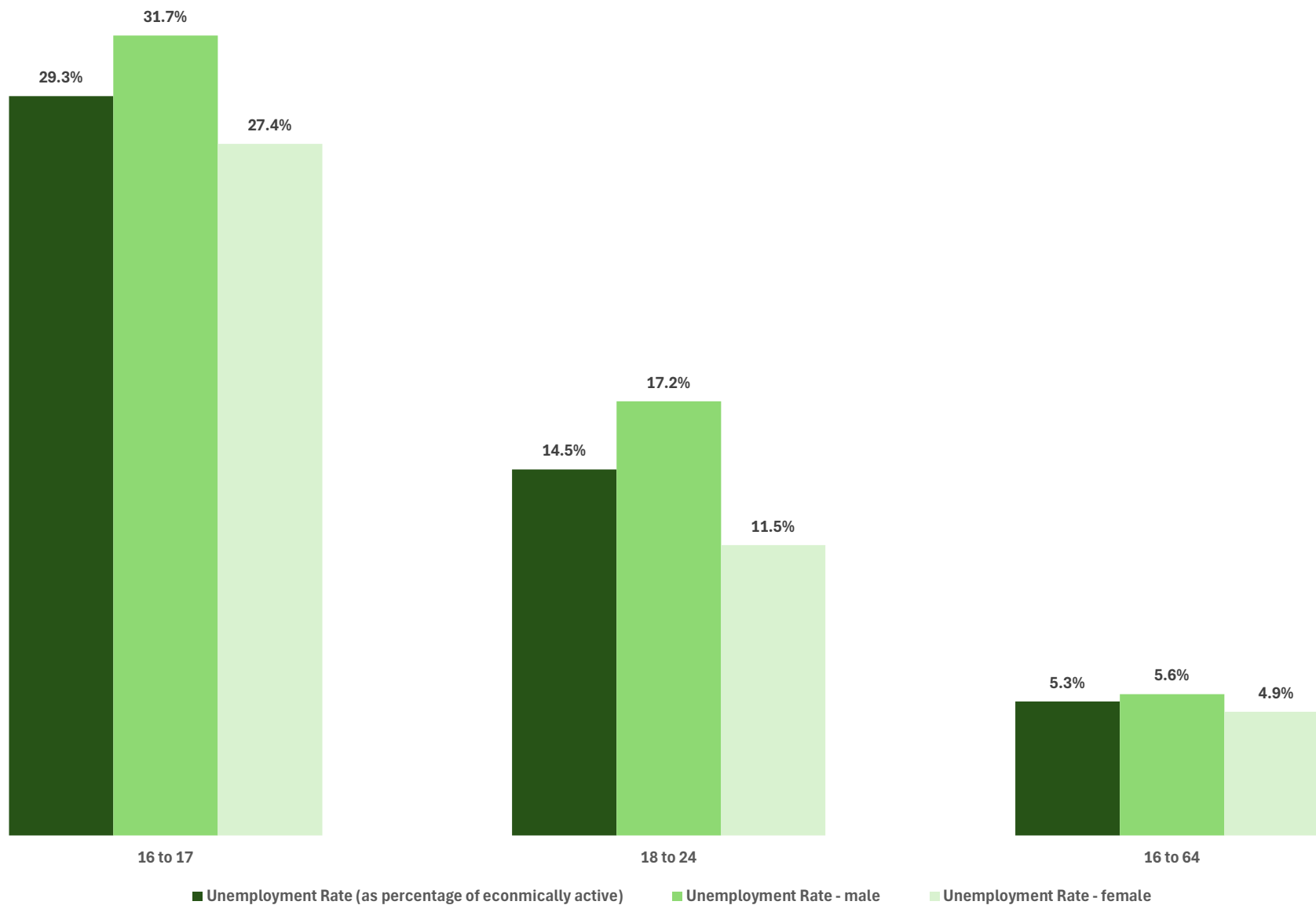
Changes to Unemployment, Employment and Economic Inactivity Rates since the same period last year - UK



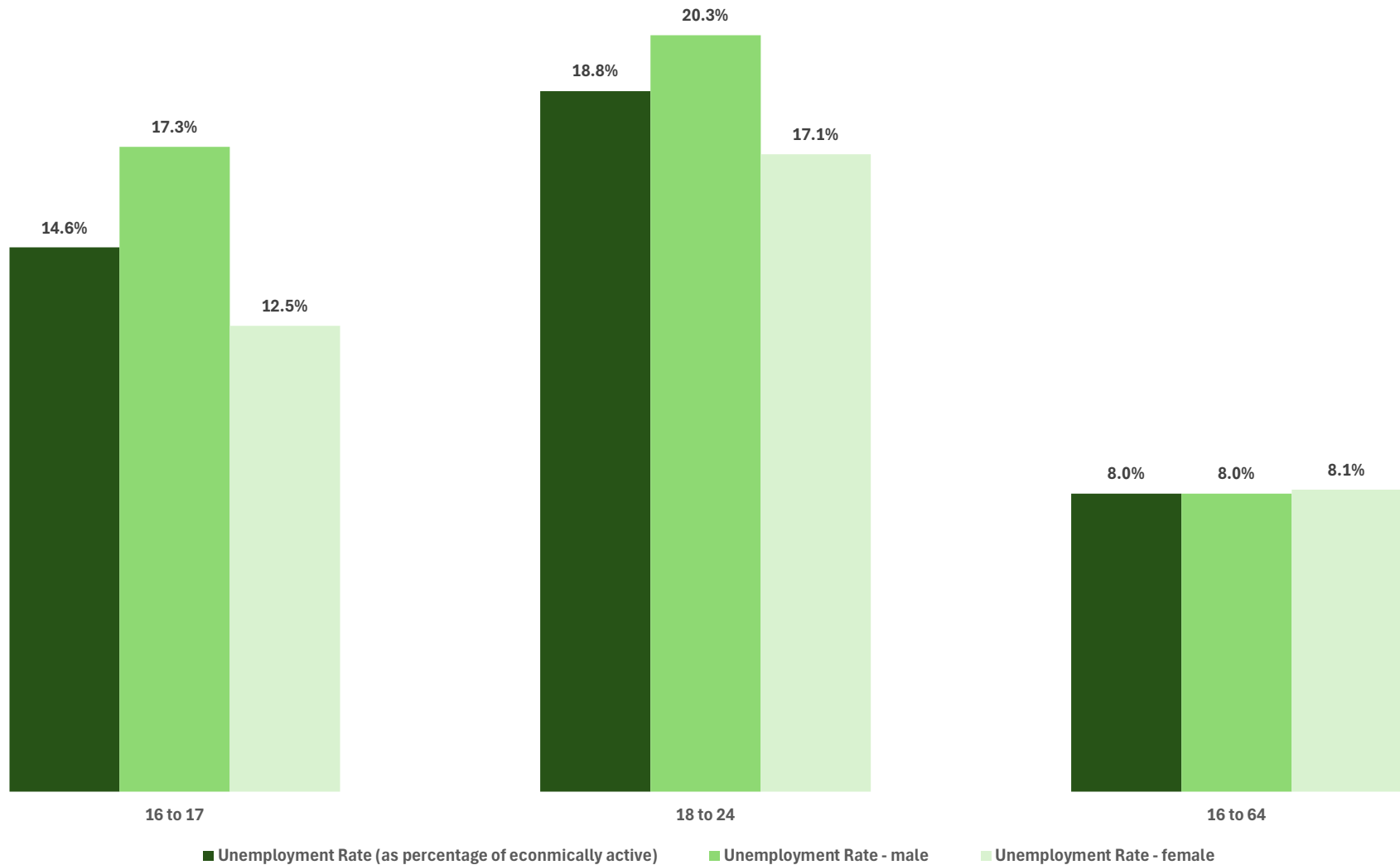

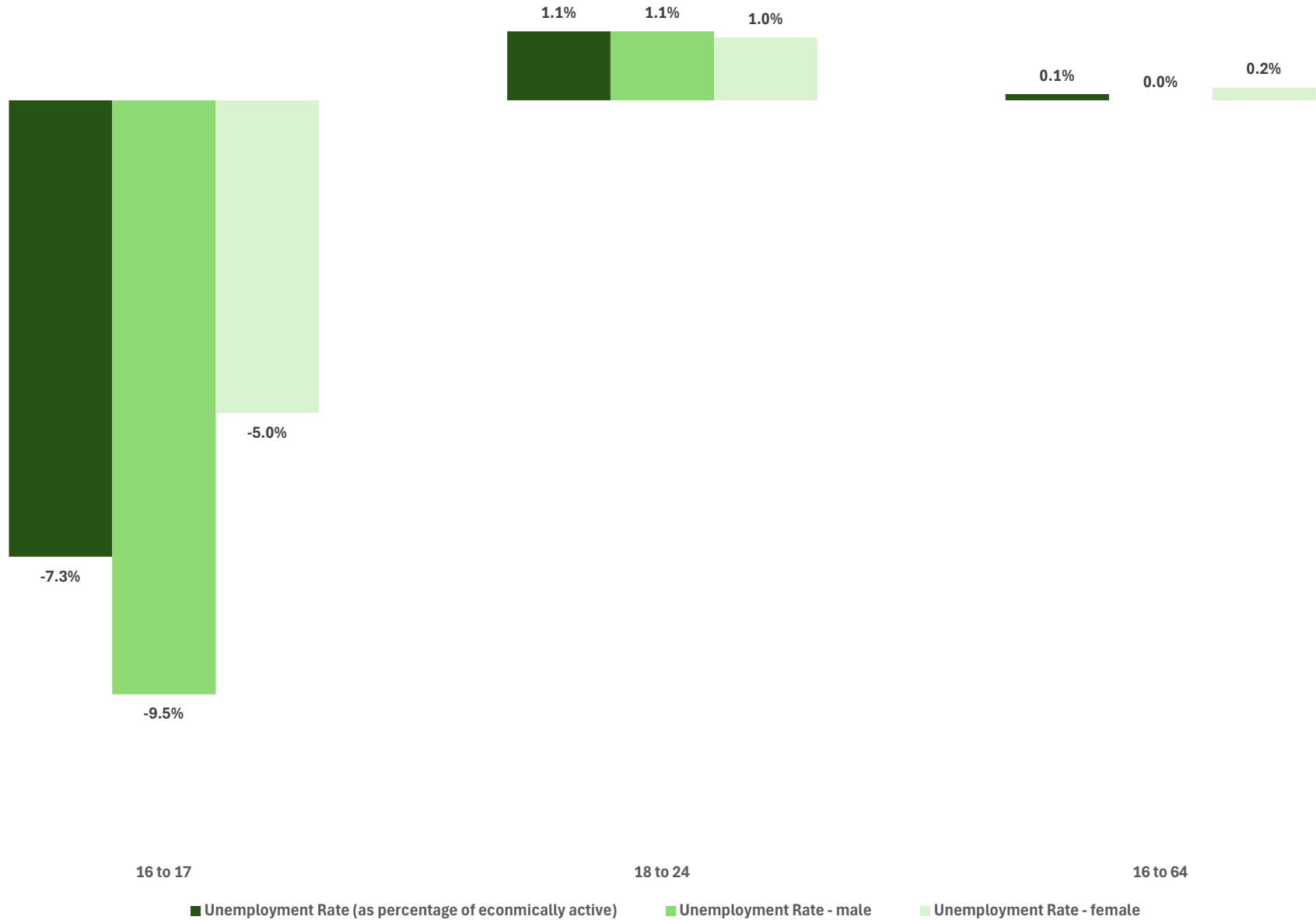
**Overall Unemployment Rate, Unemployment Rate - male and Unemployment Rate - female
for the current reporting period - UK**



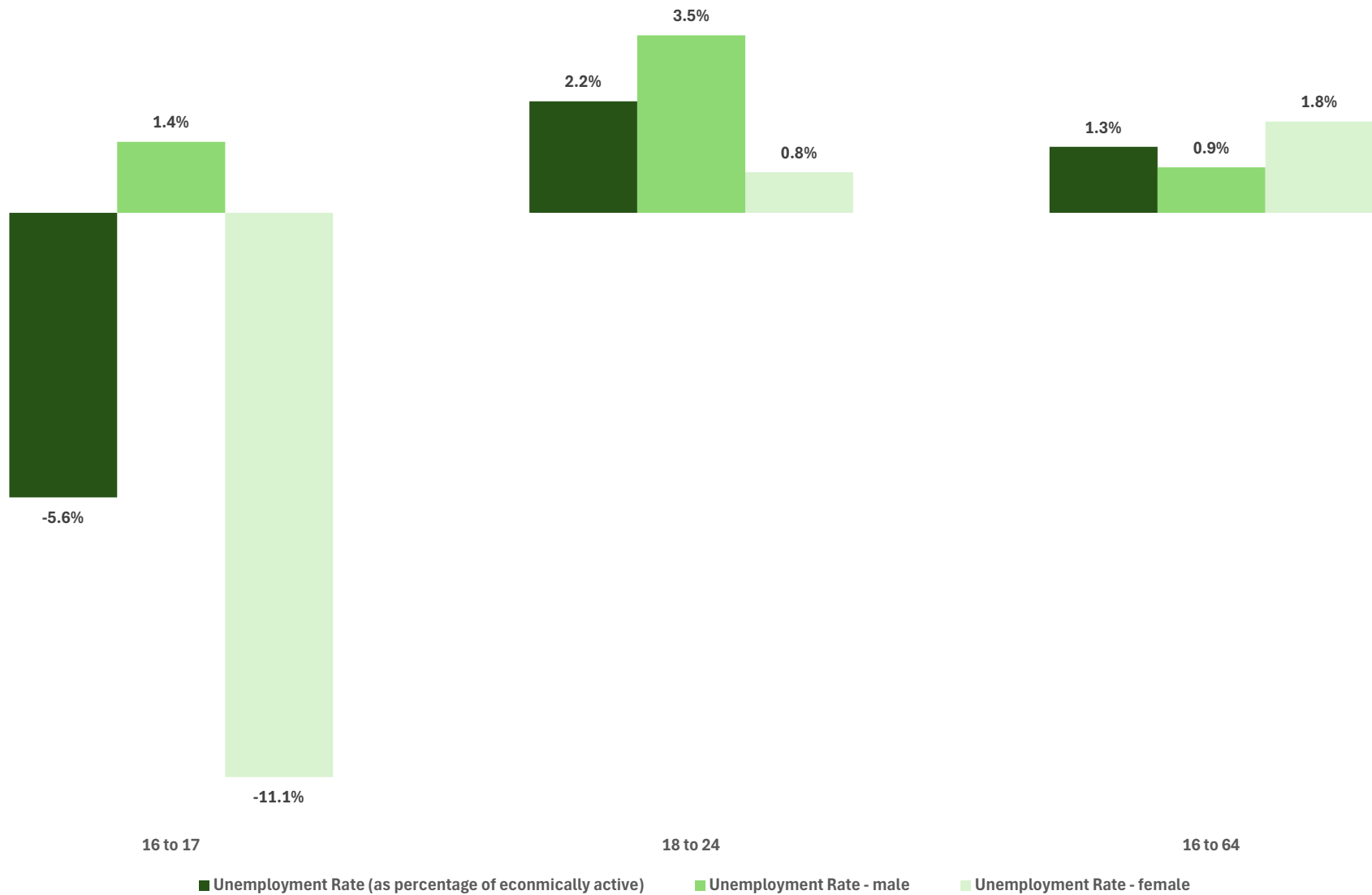
**Overall Unemployment Rate, Unemployment Rate - male and Unemployment Rate - female
for the current reporting period - London**



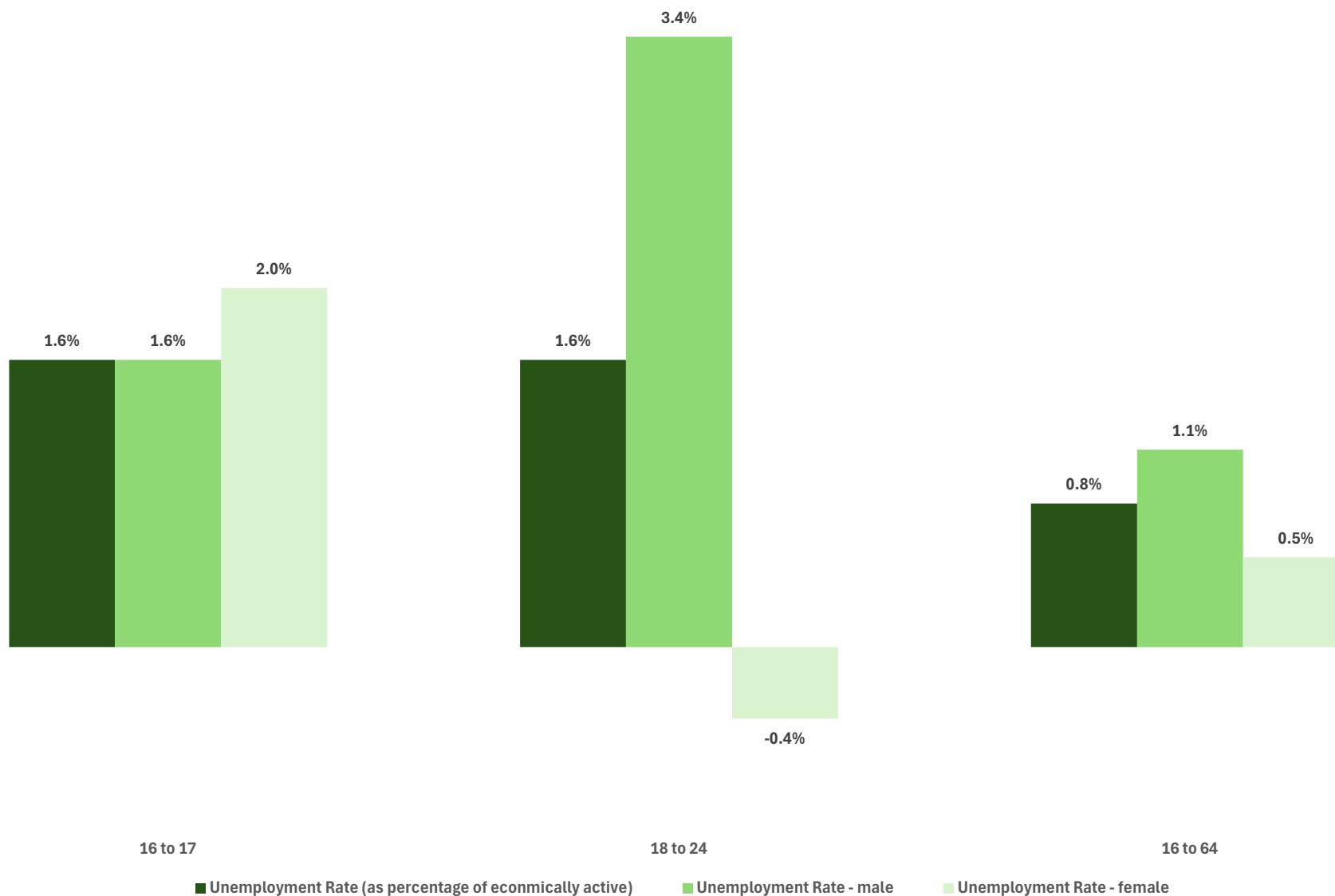
Changes to Overall Unemployment Rate, Unemployment Rate - male and Unemployment Rate - female since the previous reporting period - UK



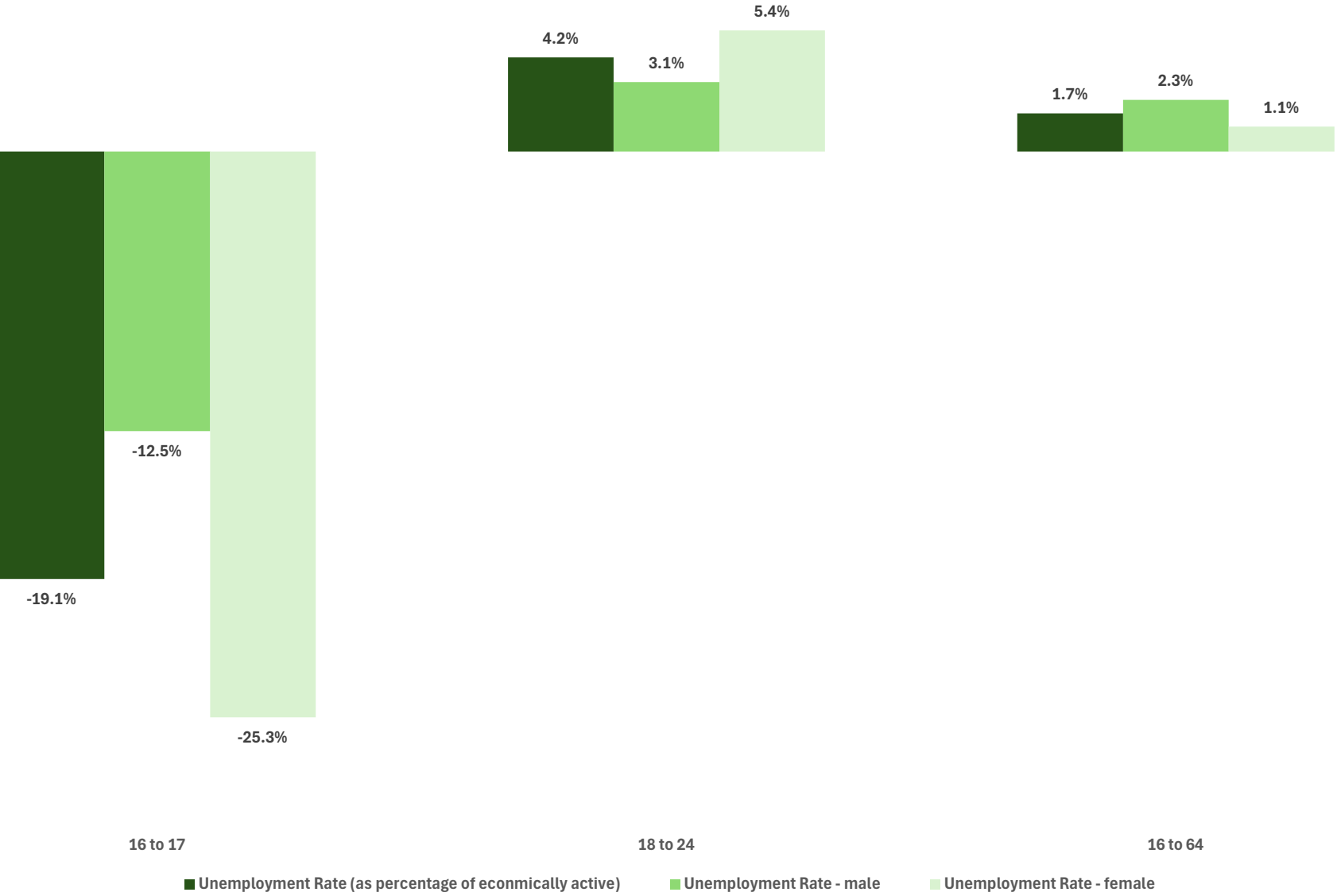

and Unemployment Rate - female since the same period last year - UK



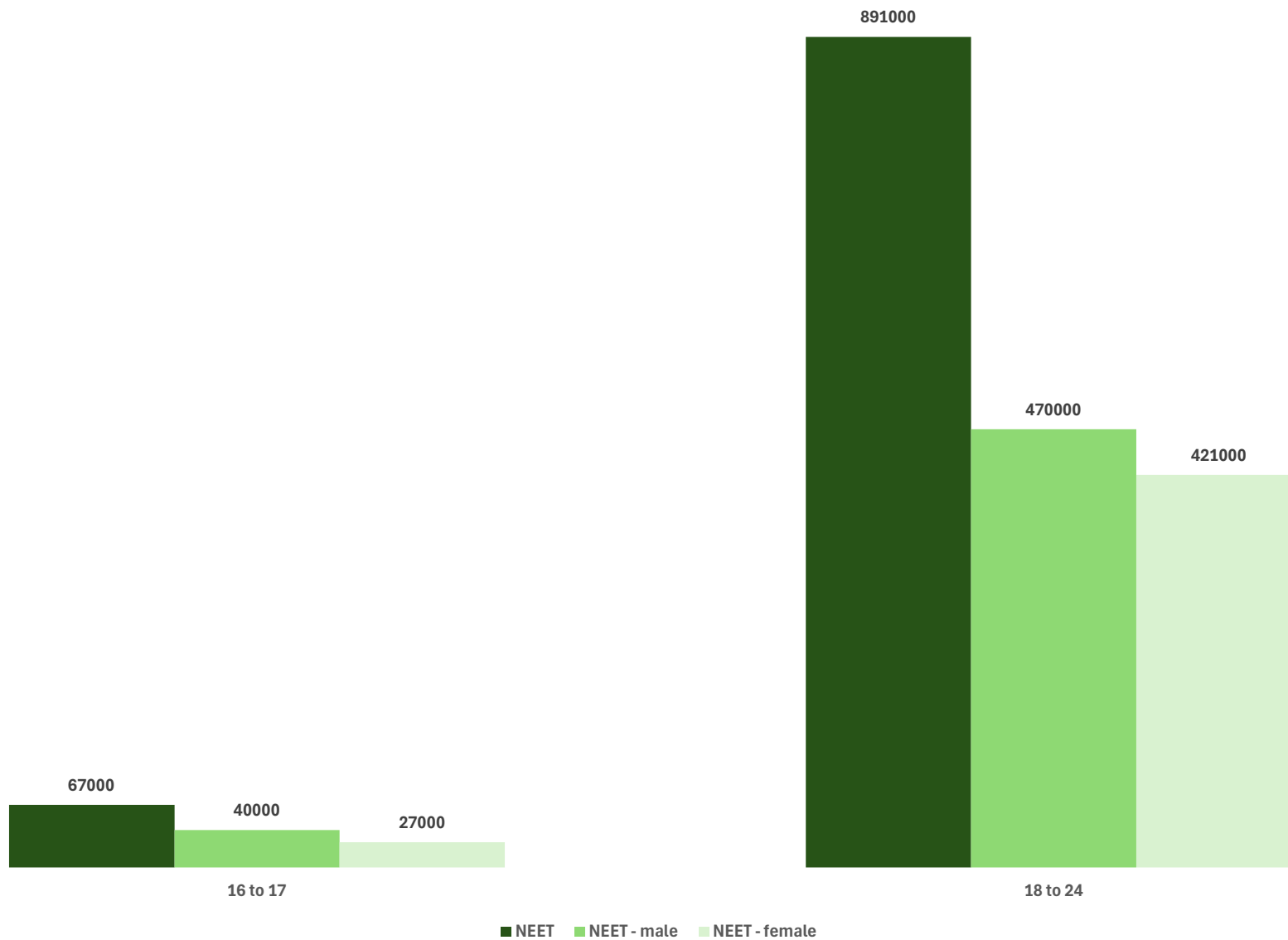

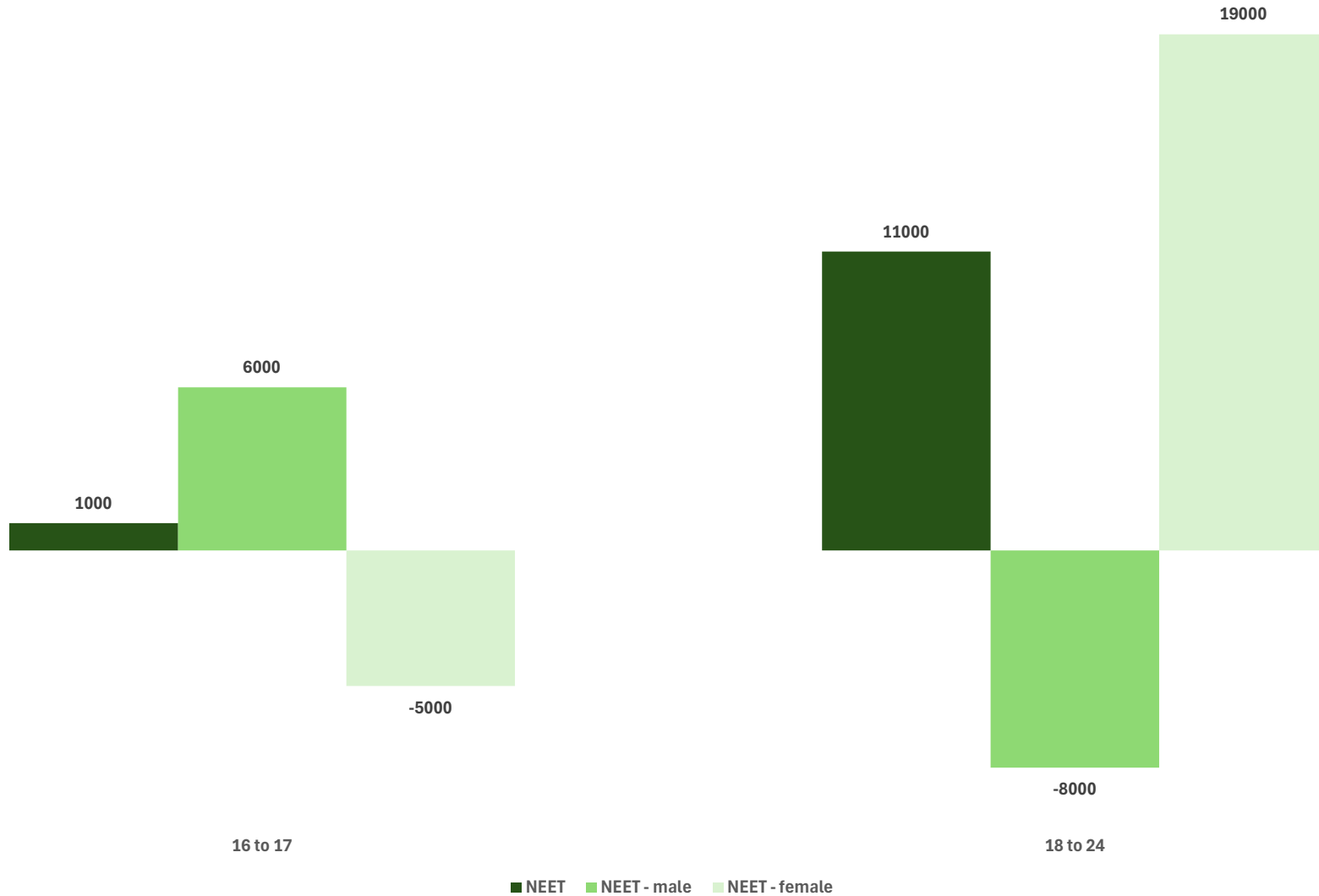

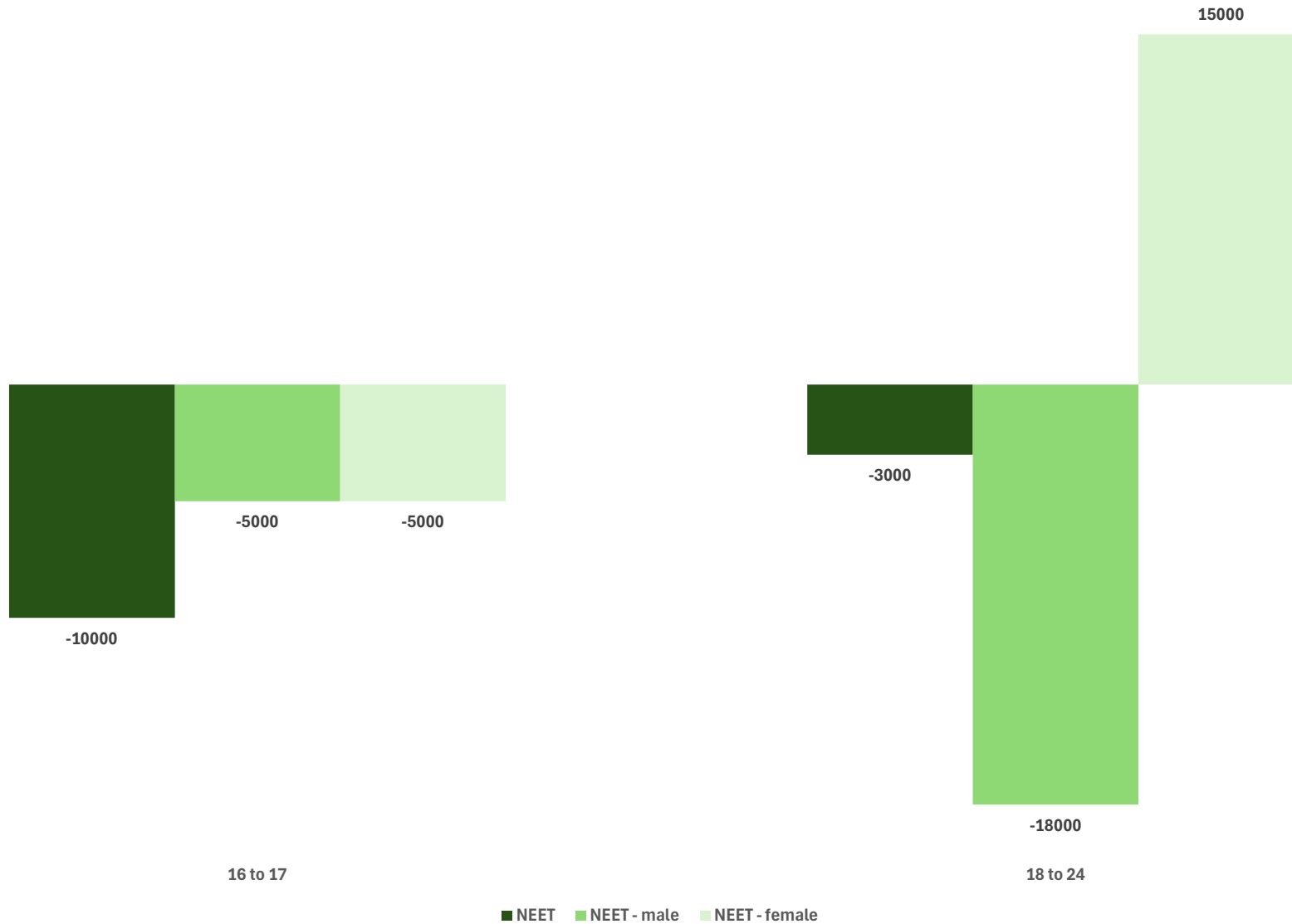
**NEET, NEET - male and NEET - female Rates

since the previous reporting period - UK

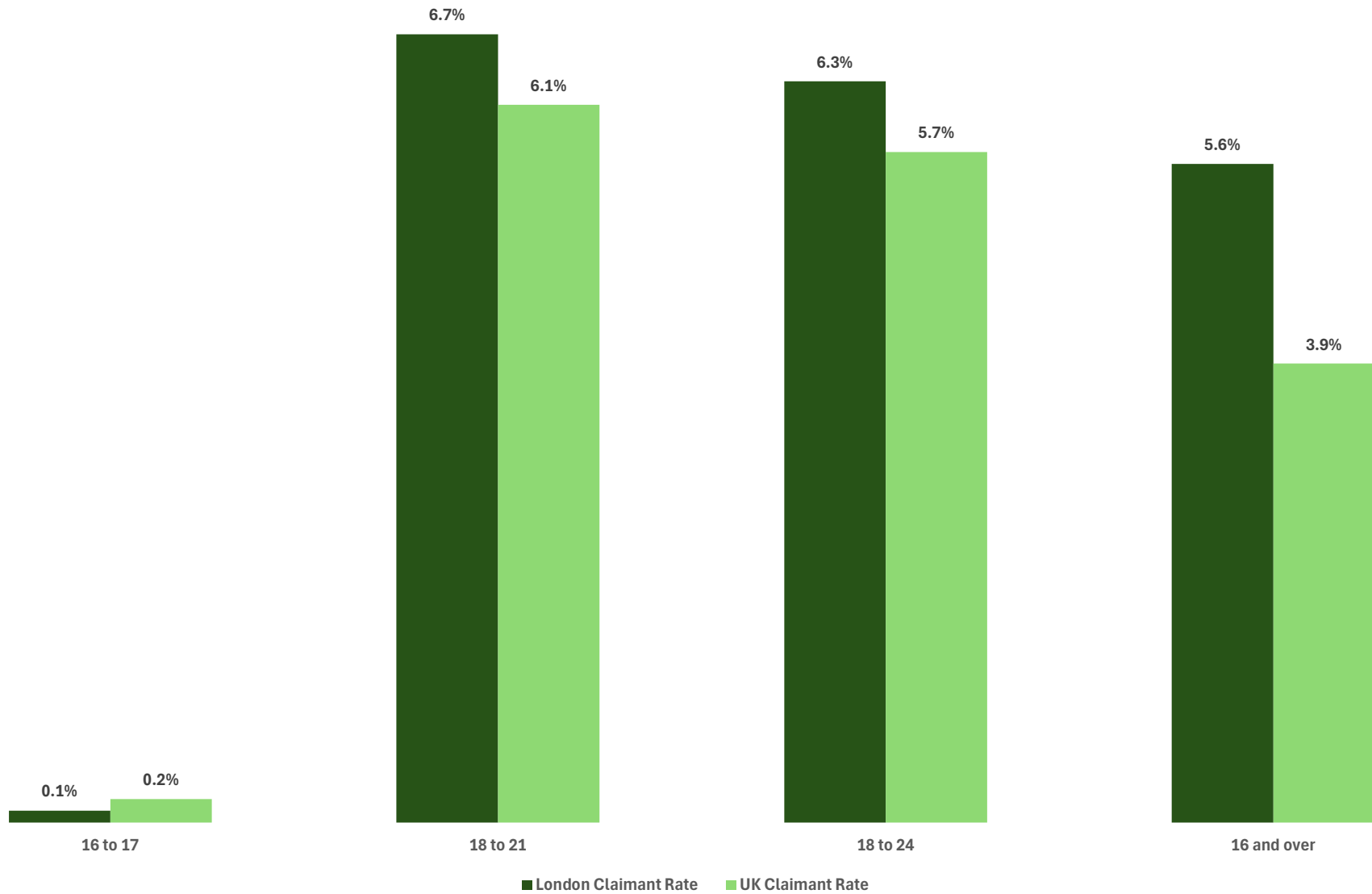

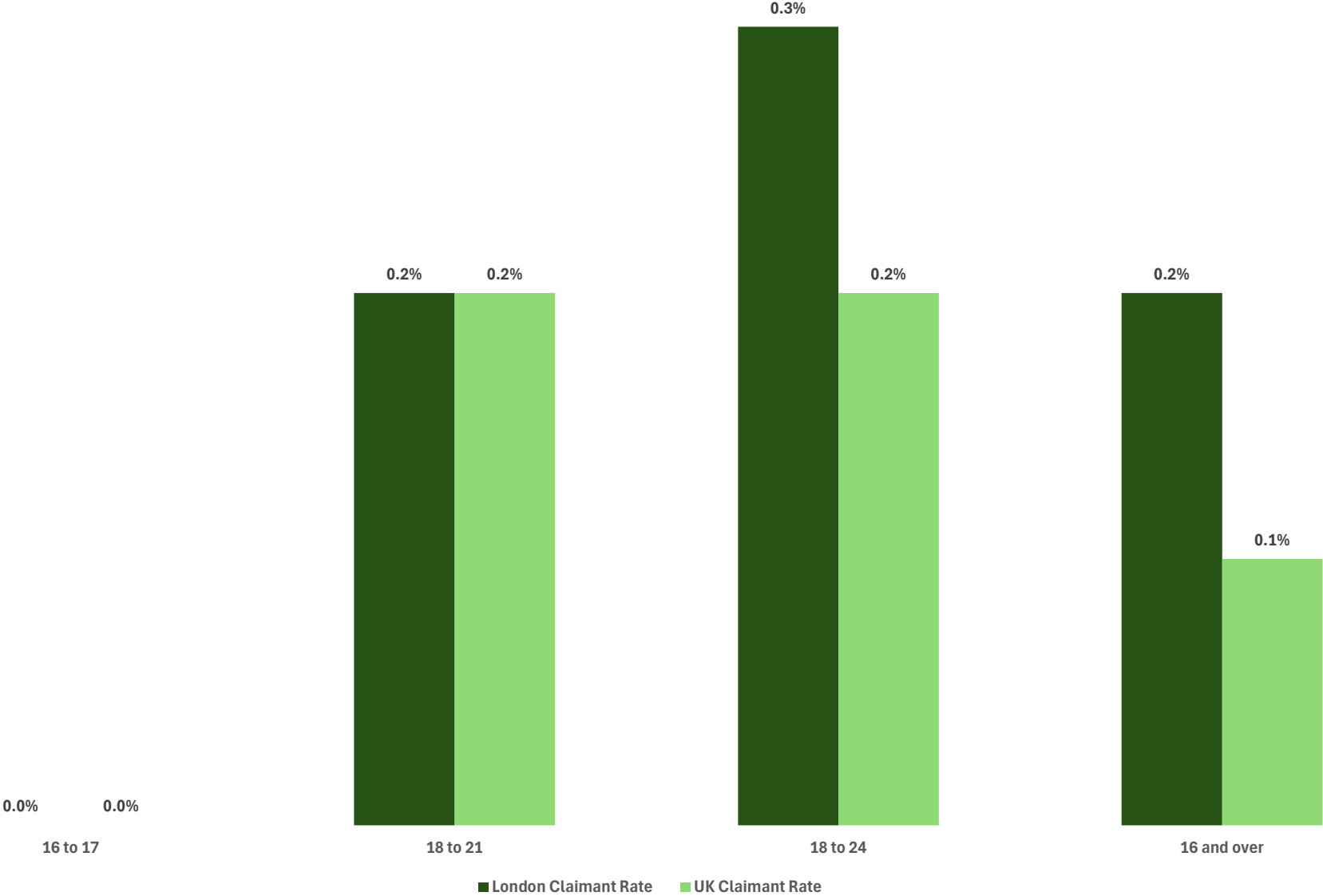

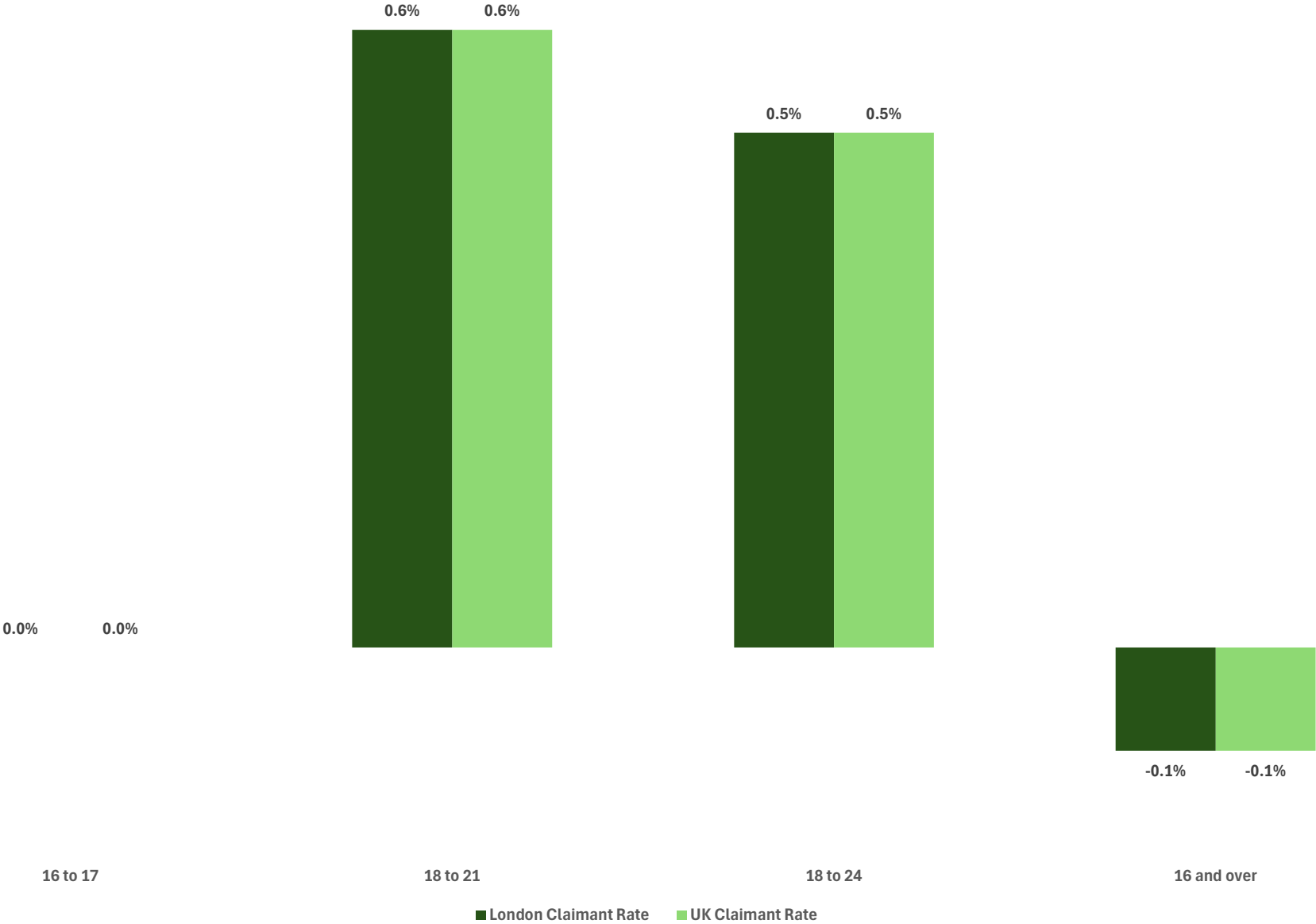
Claimant Rate for the current reporting period

Changes to Claimant Rates since the same period last year

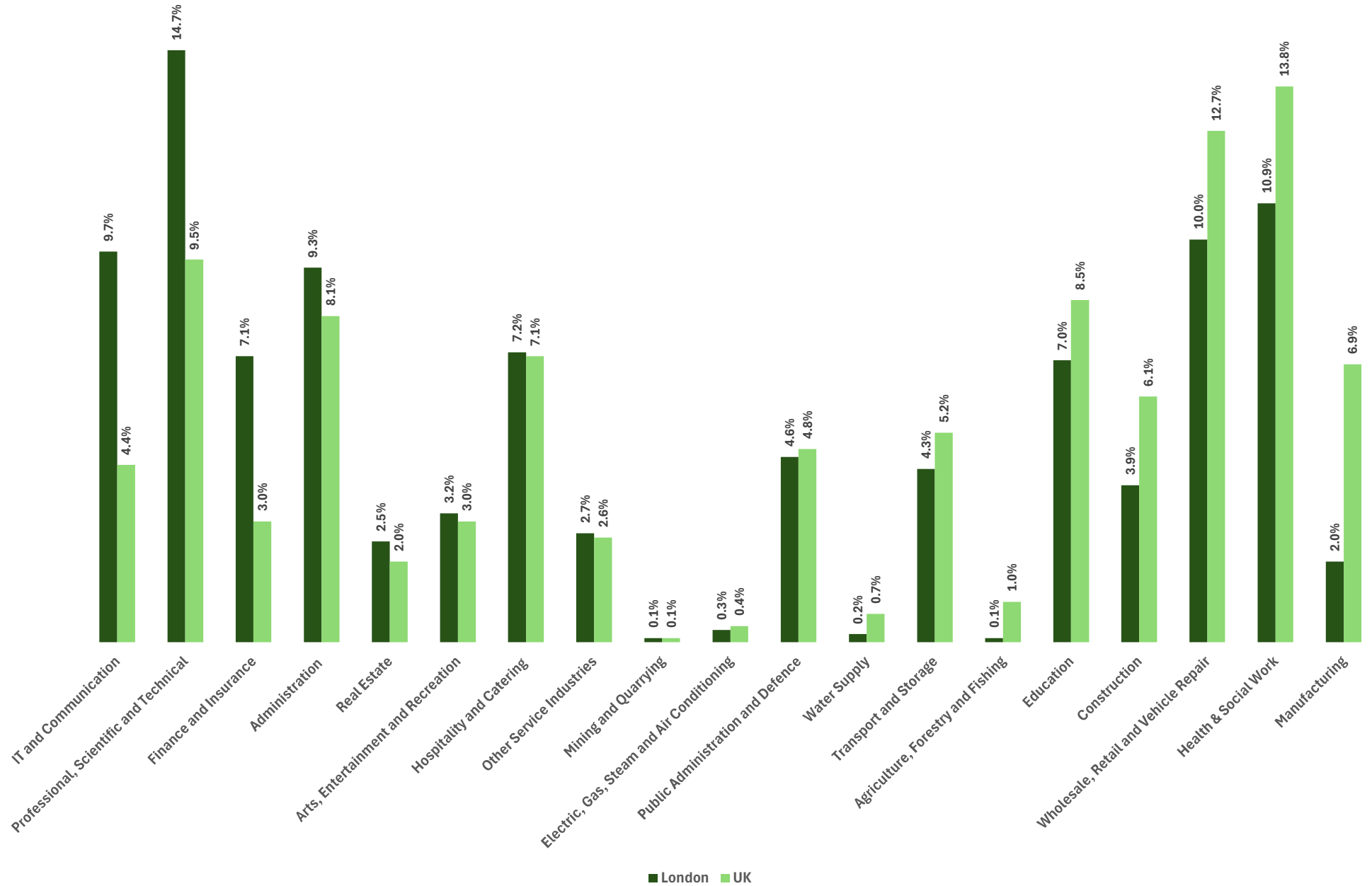

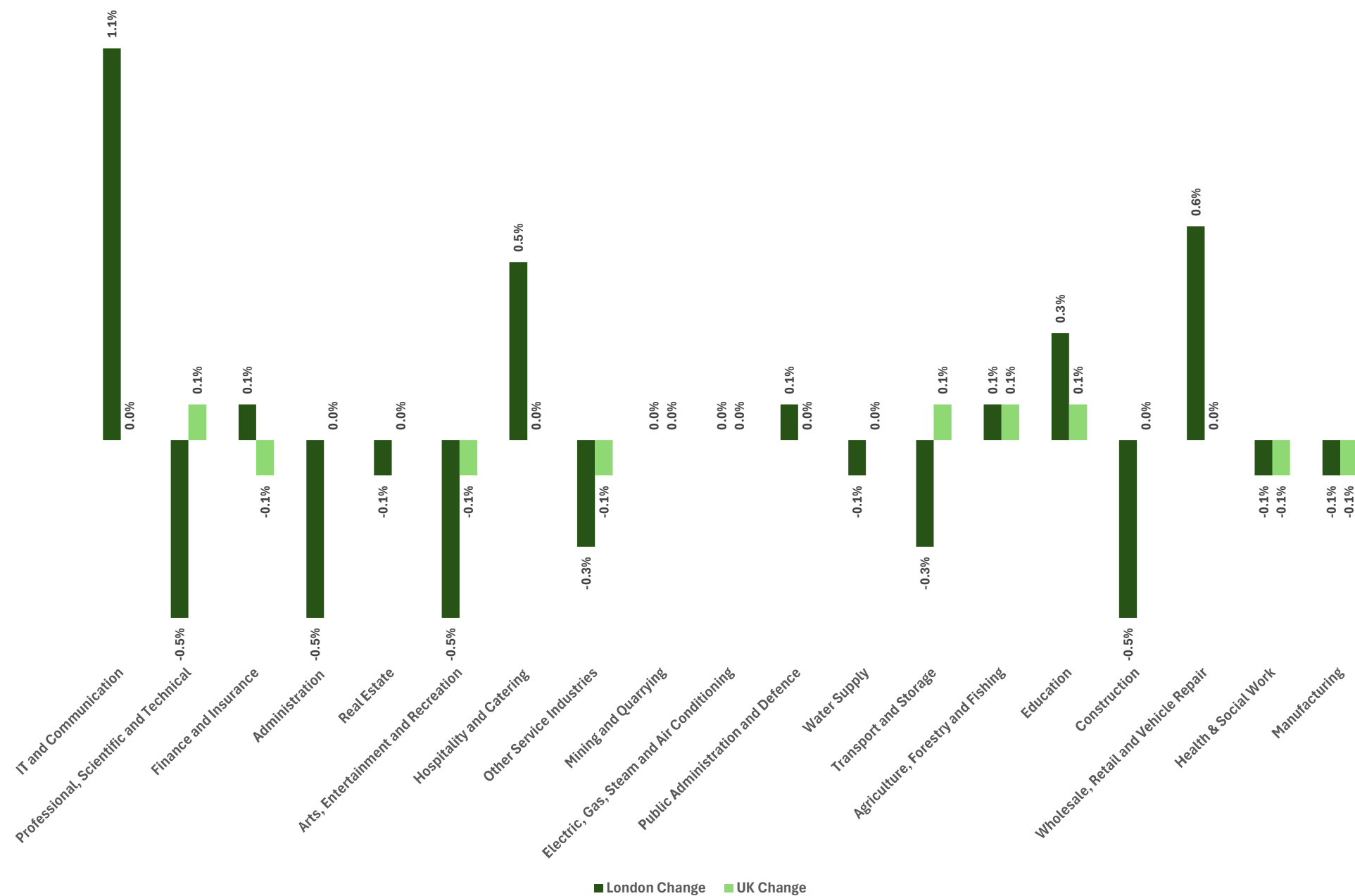

Changes to Employment in London and the UK by Sector since the previous reporting period

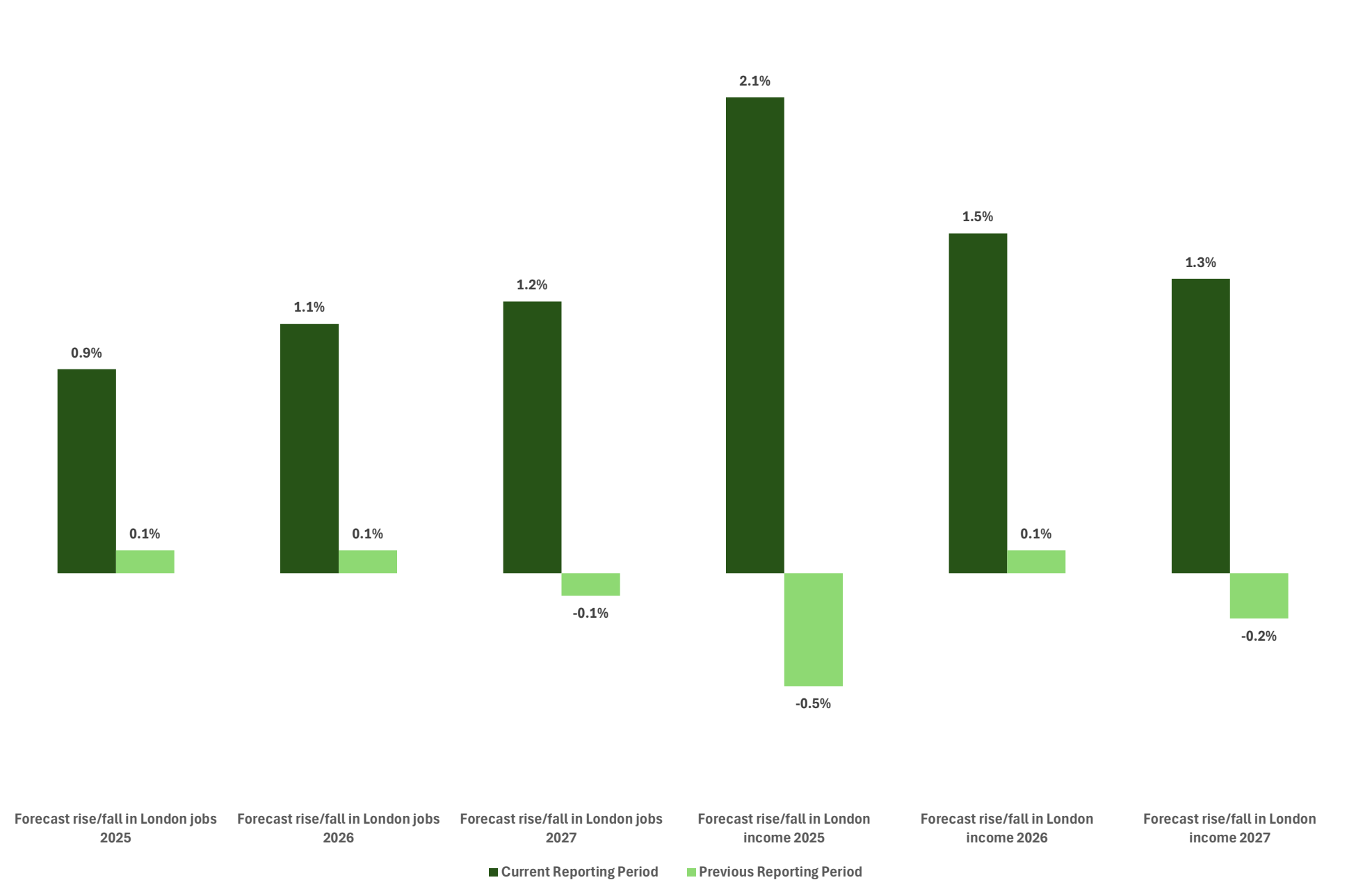

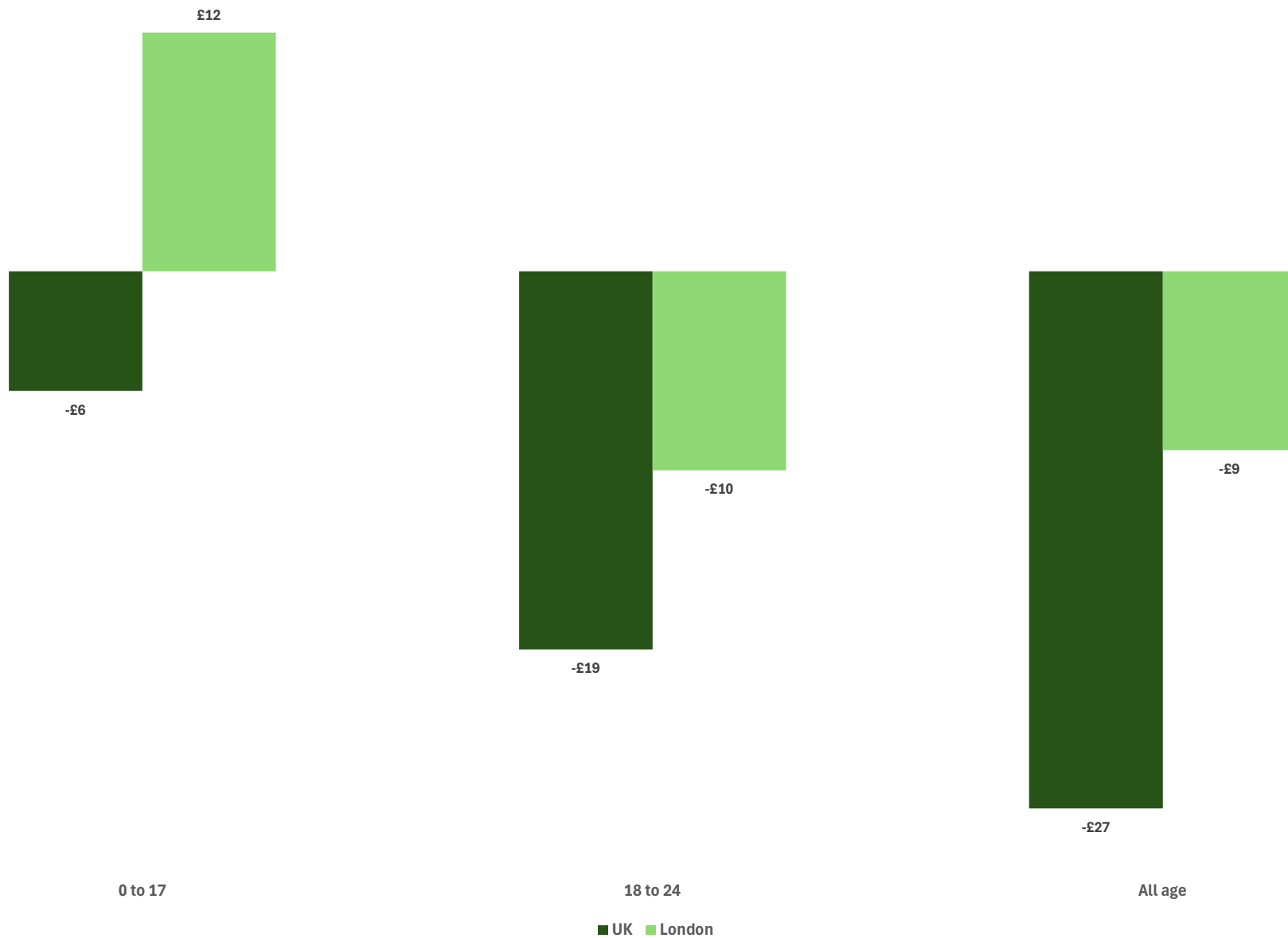

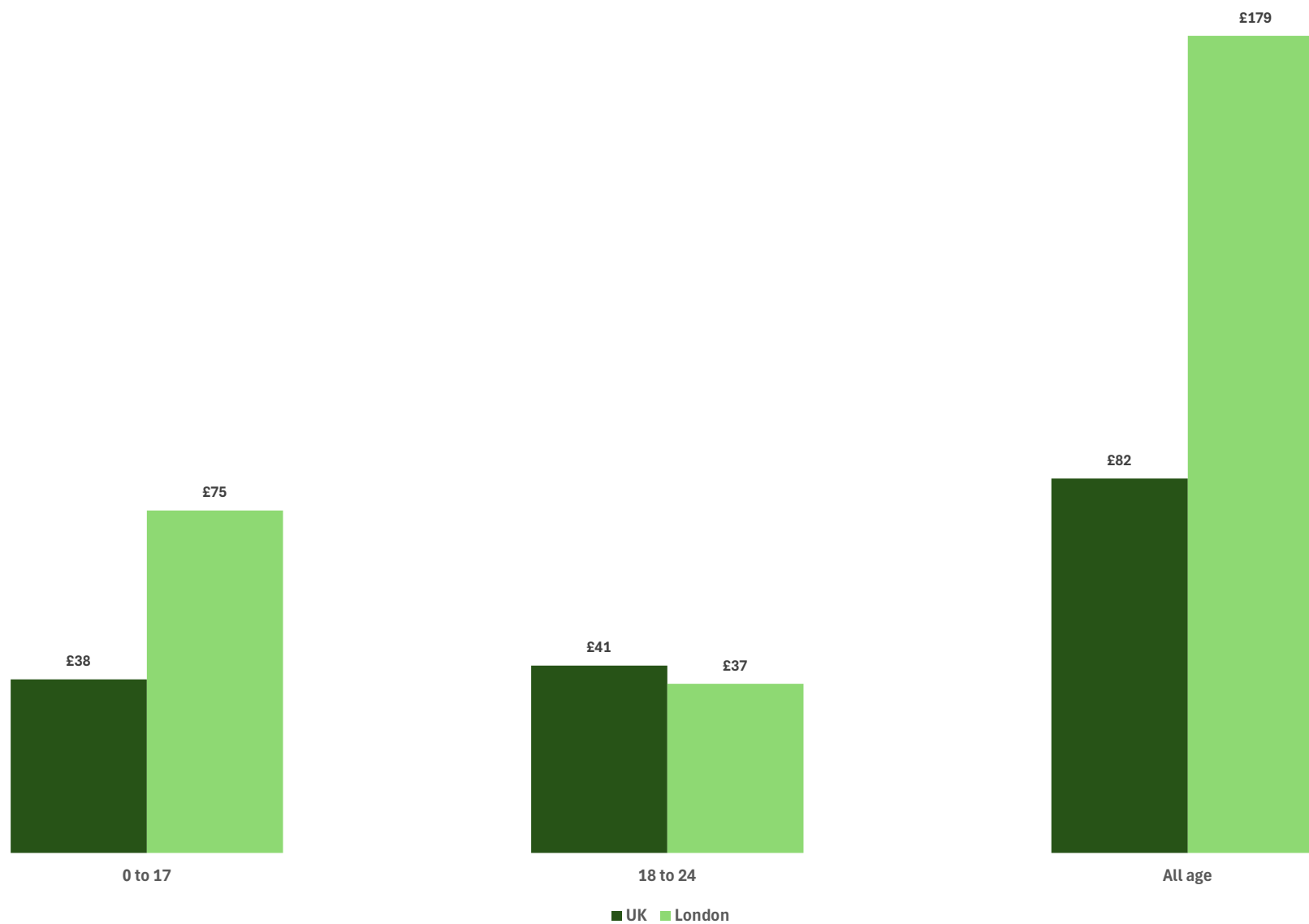
Mean Pay Rates for the current reporting period - UK and London
based on home, not place of work. of worker



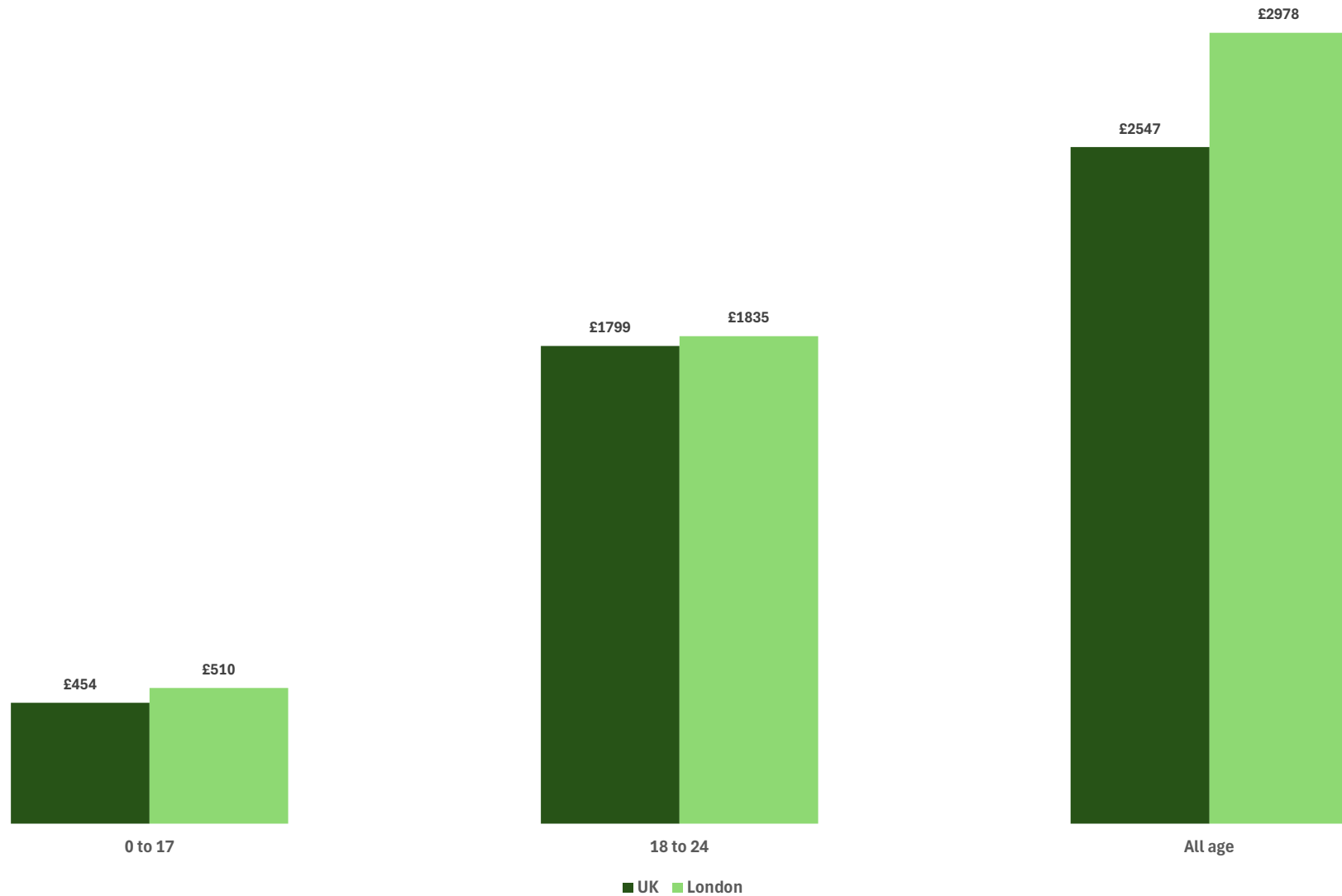
Changes in Mean Pay Rates since the previous reporting period - UK and London
based on home, not place of work, of worker



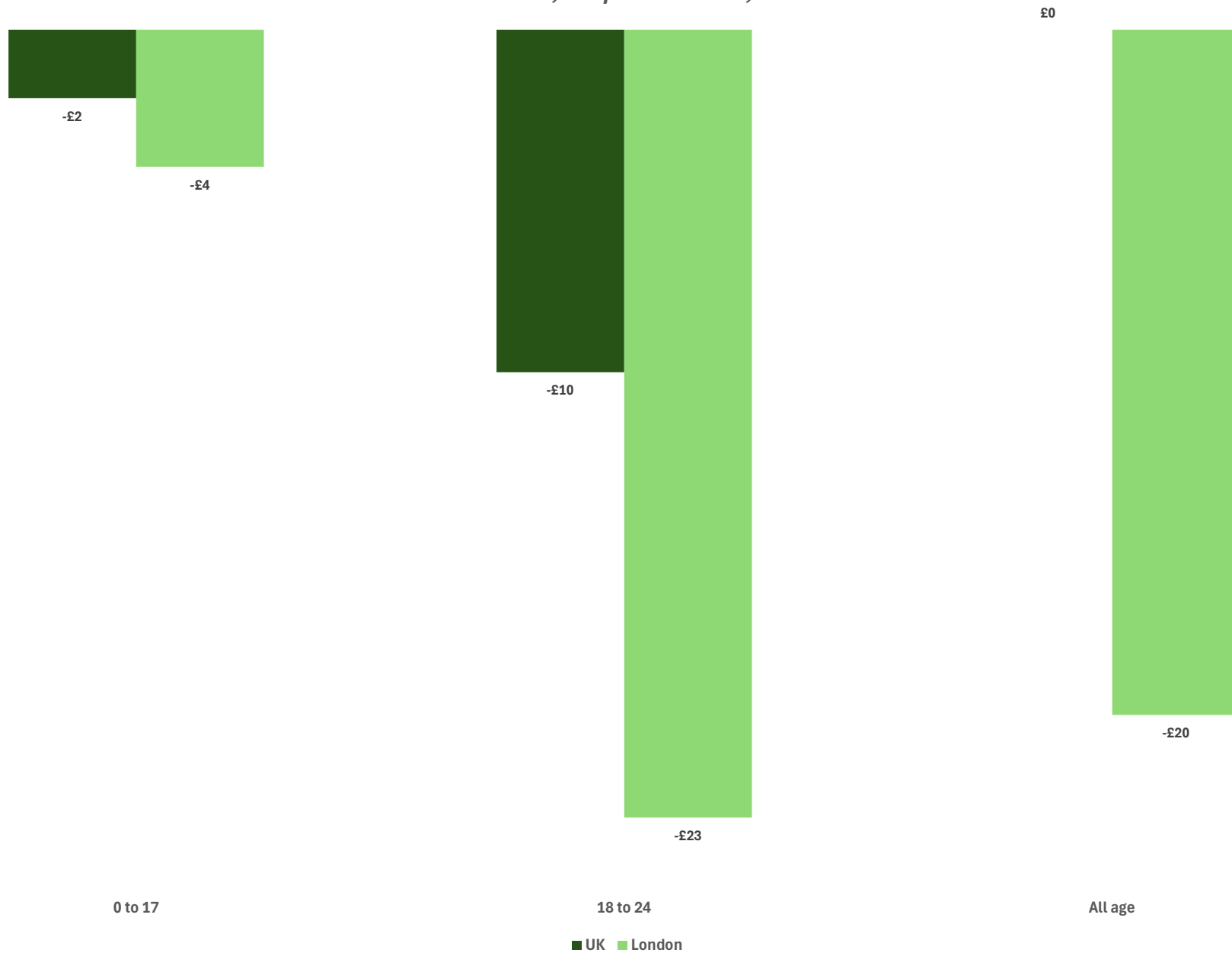
Changes to Mean Pay since the same period last year - UK and London
based on home, not place of work, of worker



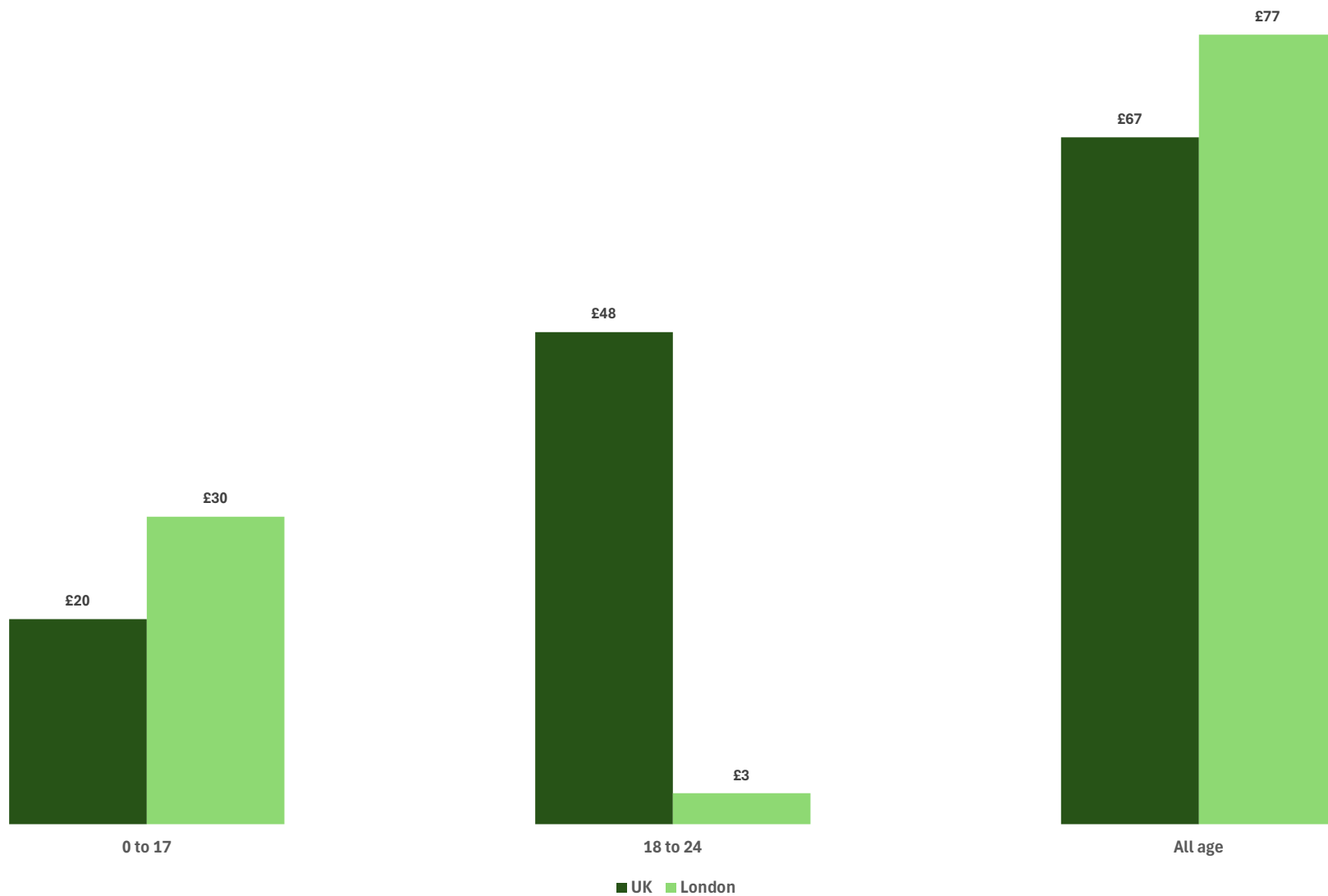
Median Pay Rates for the current reporting period - UK and London

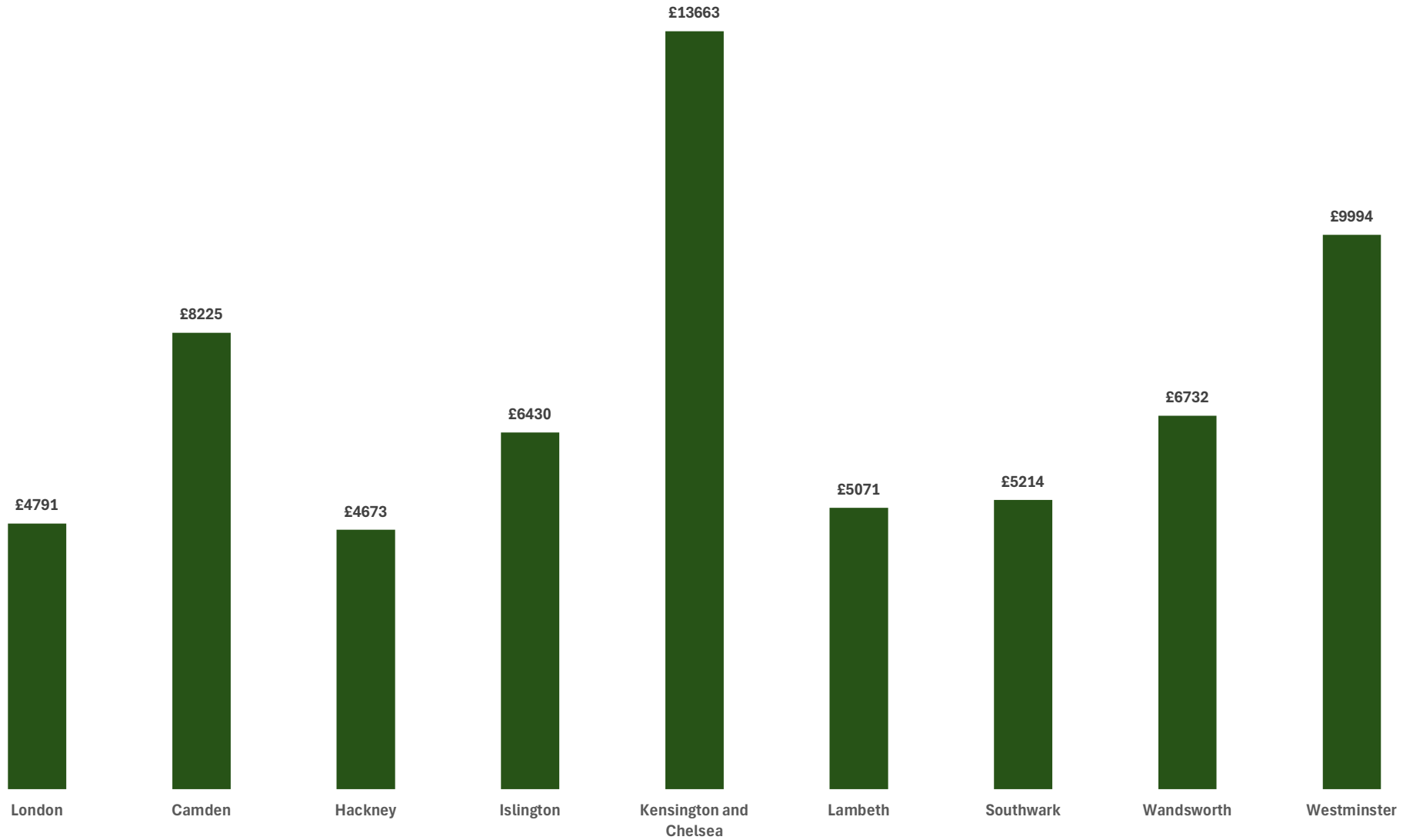

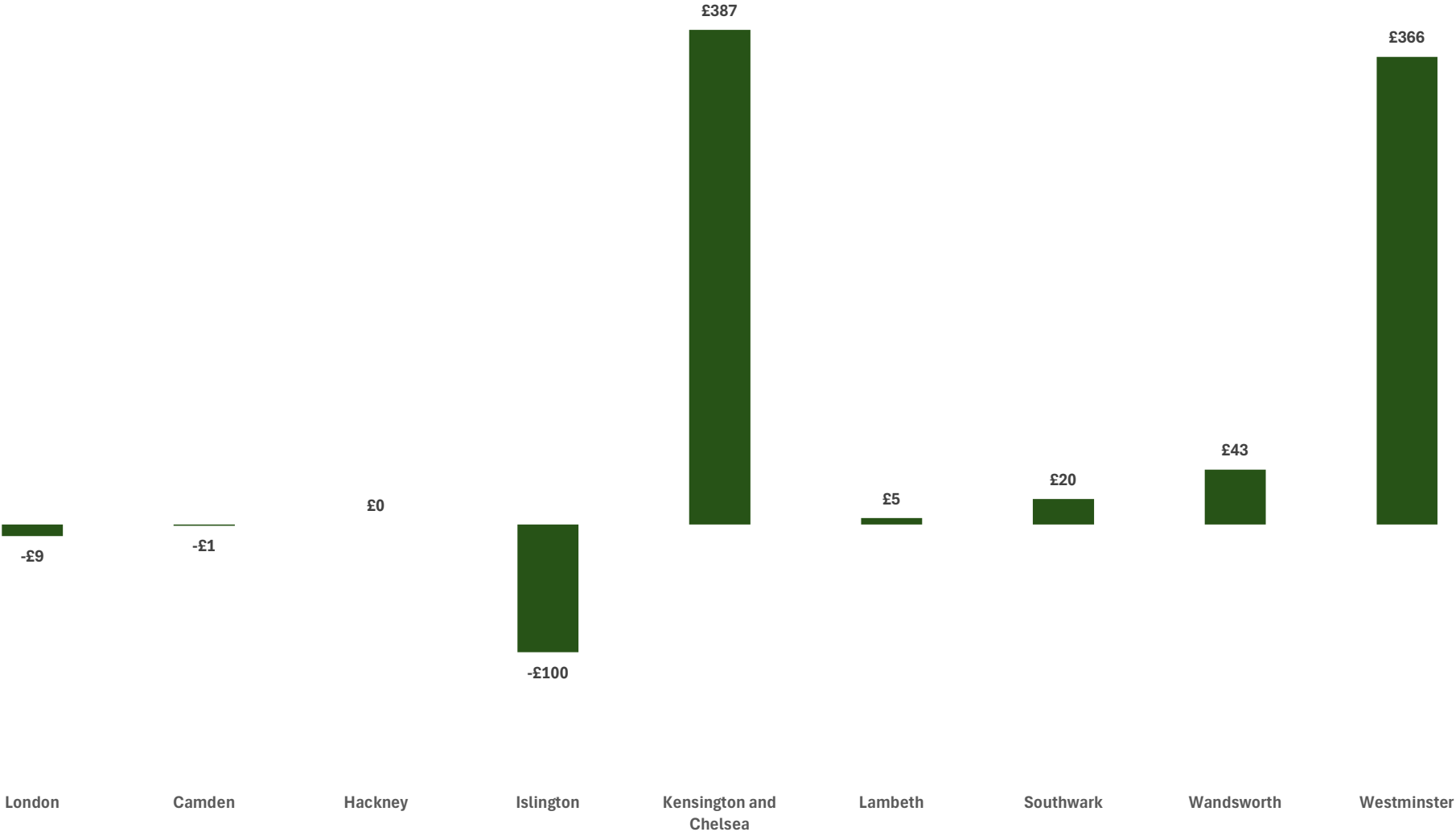

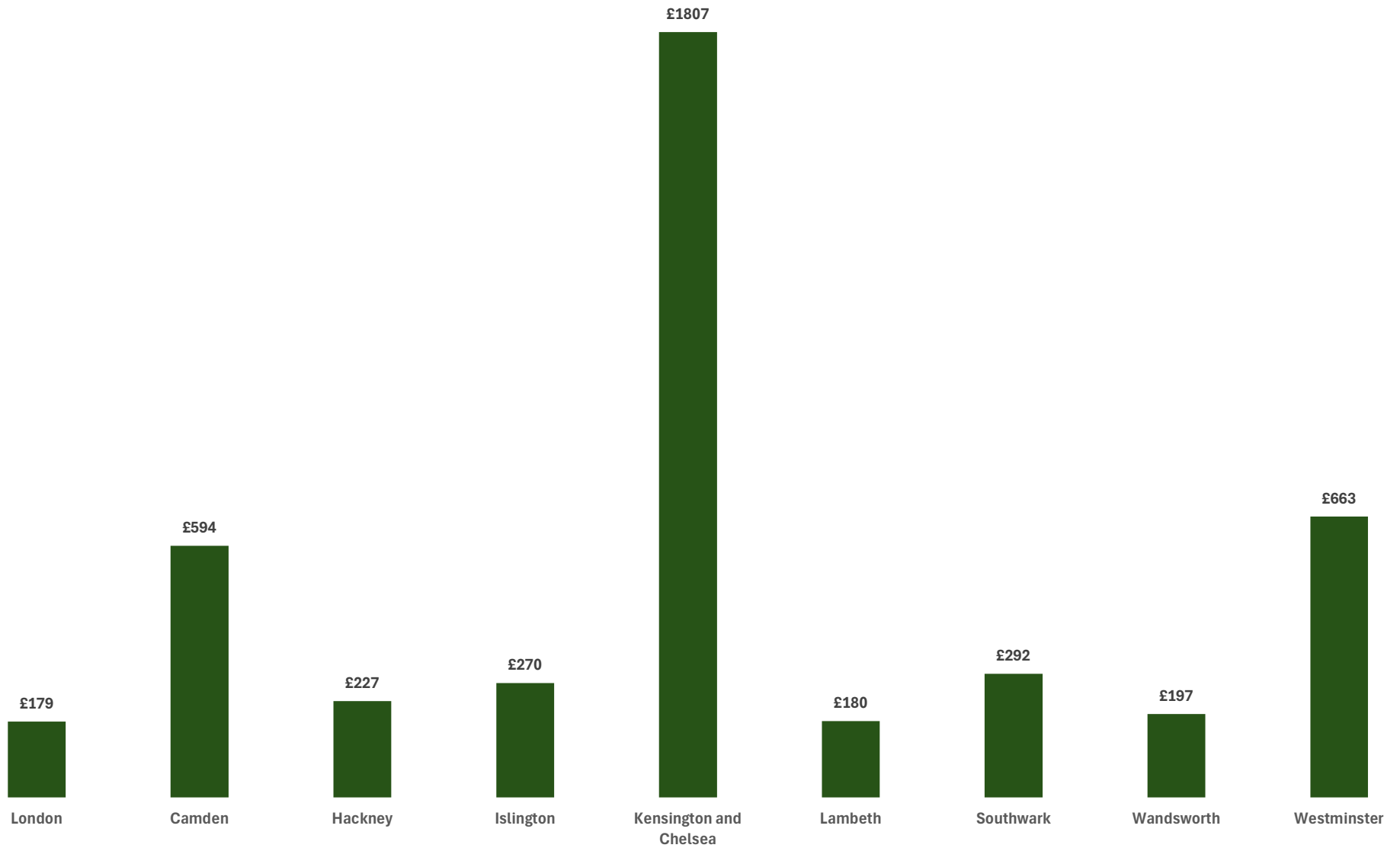
Mean Pay Rates for the current reporting period - London and individual CEIAG boroughs
based on home, not place of work, of worker



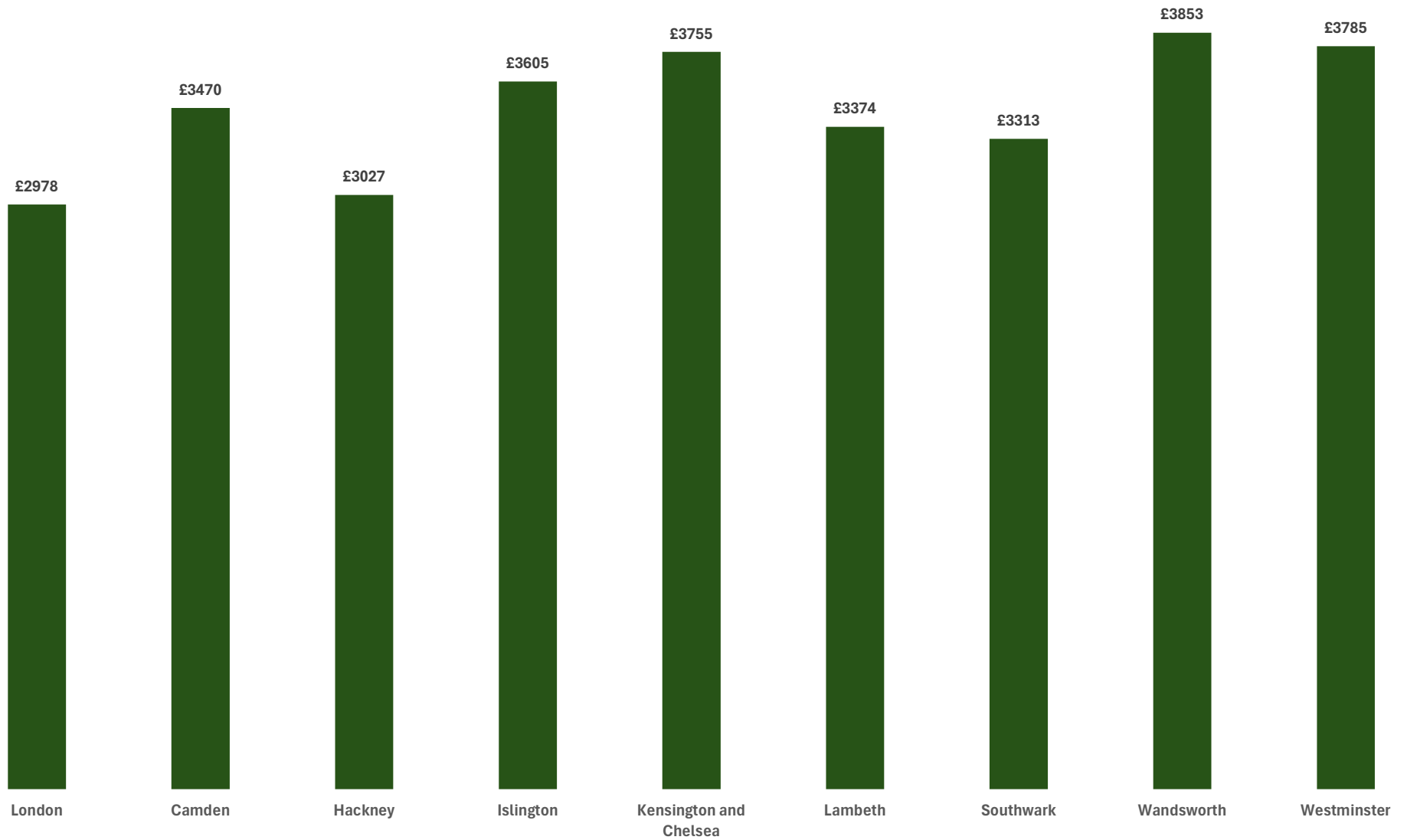
Changes to Mean Pay Rates since previous reporting period

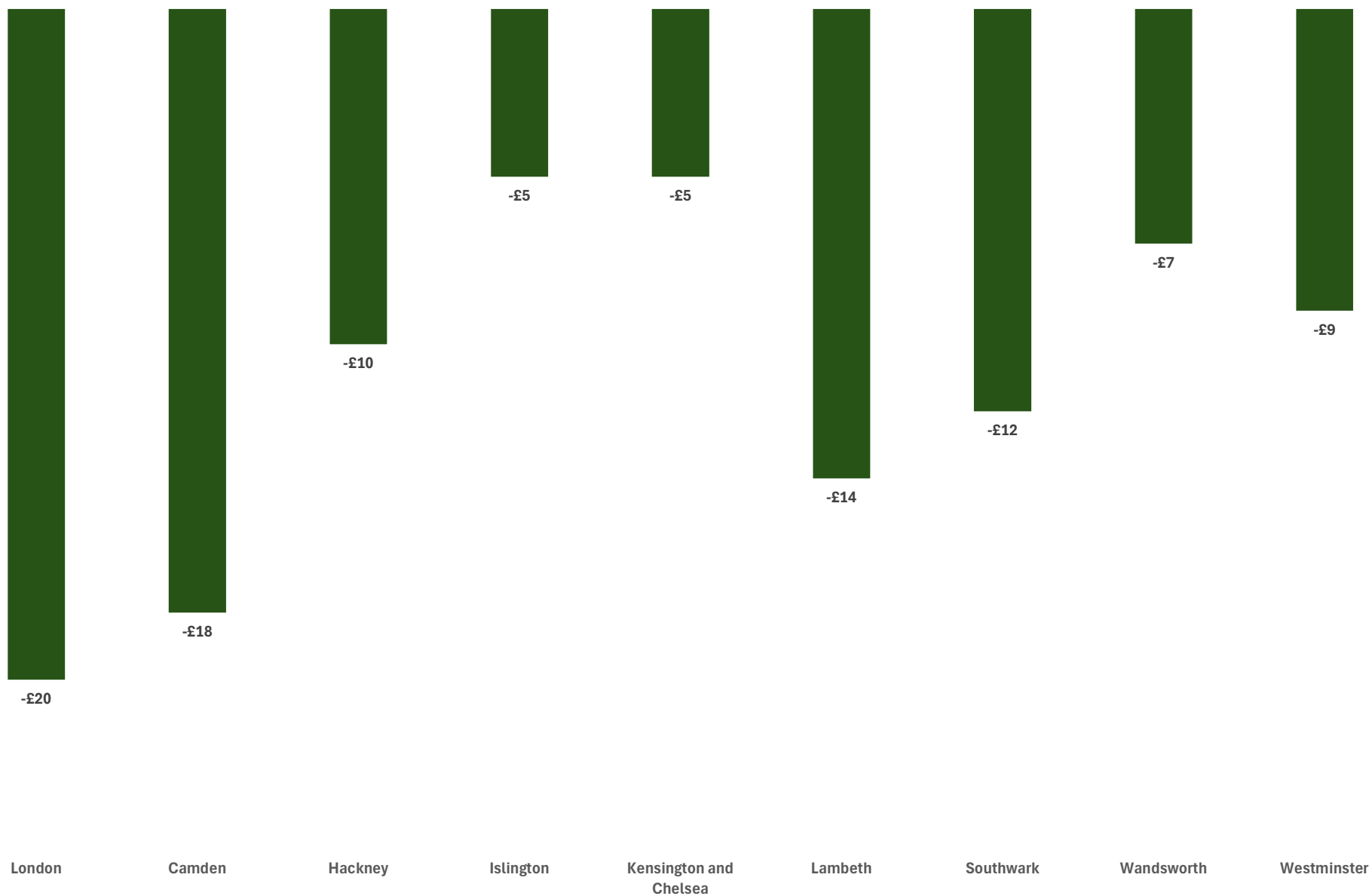
Changes to Mean Pay Rate since the same period last year

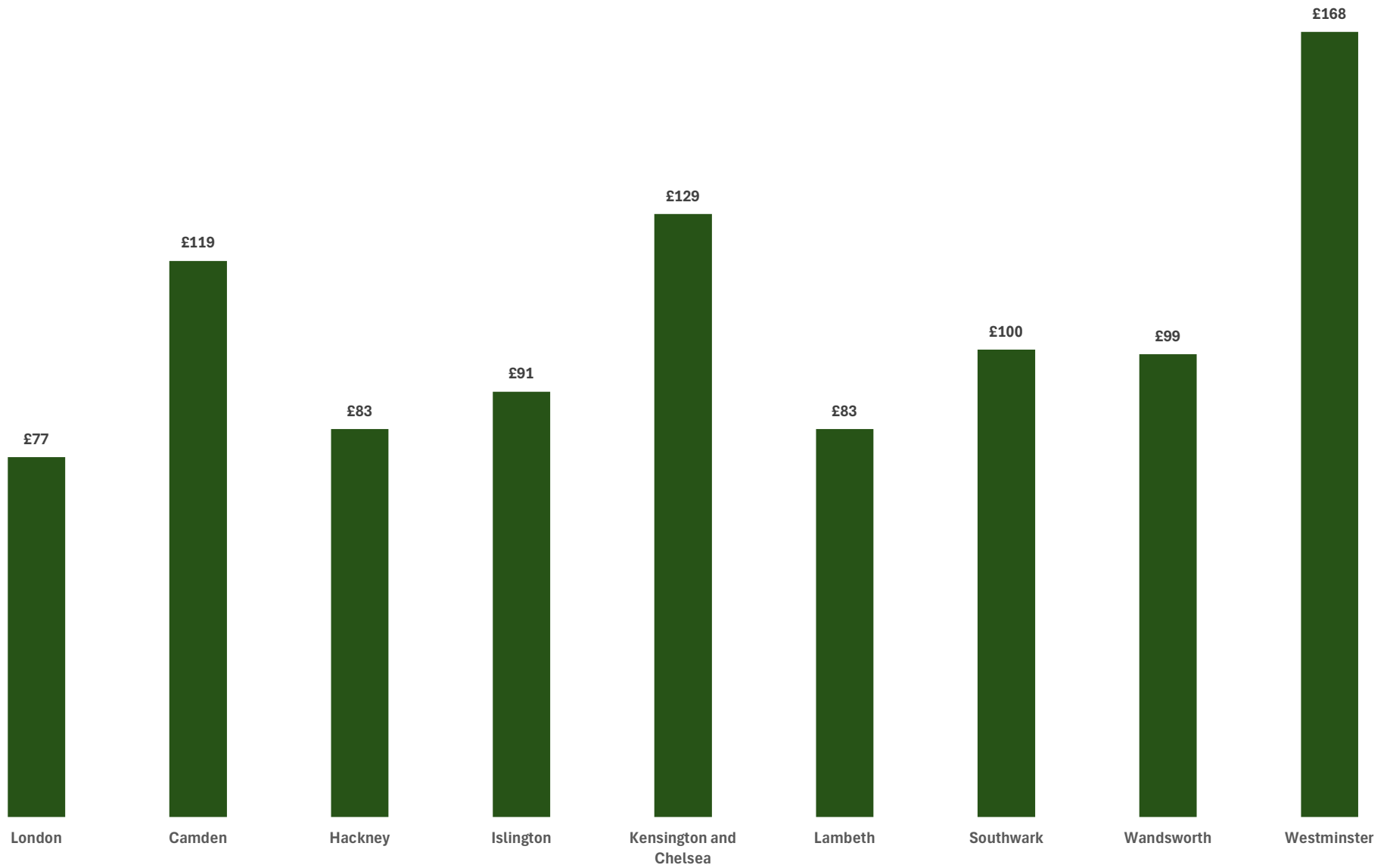
Median Pay Rates for the current reporting period - London and individual CEIAG boroughs
